FROM THE EDITOR

ADVERTISING AND MARKETING YOUR COBS

A topic that I regularly discuss with subscribers who phone me is how to find and purchase the proper pony or horse. A major point of frustration is that when the prospective buyer calls for information on a particular animal, the seller is extremely friendly and informative but then never follows up with the promised photographs and/or videos. We ourselves have experienced this non-response to our requests for further information and have made the decision to remove that particular animal from our list of possible purchase candidates. We have generally had an easier time getting videos and photos from the U.K. than from sellers here in America. I am not sure why this is the case, but many sales are lost due to poor follow-up with interested prospective purchasers.

Before you choose to advertise your pony or Cob, be certain that you do indeed wish to sell this animal. It is amazing how many owners change their minds when the sale becomes a real possibility. I know that it is difficult to part with our beloved Cobs, but it is frustrating and sometimes heartbreaking for a purchaser to fall in love with a horse and then have the seller back out at the 11th hour, having changed his or her mind. Weigh everything before placing that ad. Granted, sometimes situations do change, but this should be the exception, and not the rule.

If financially possible, it is helpful to take out a large enough ad to include a nice photo of your Cob. The response on photo ads seems to be a bit better than a small classified, but that is really a matter of preference. Include in your ad the section of Welsh, sex, age, size, color and markings, breeding, talents, and brief show record of the animal. Your name and phone number obviously should be offered for contact purposes.

Before you advertise, take the time to get a couple of really fine photographs of your animal. Make copies of these and have them on hand to send out to prospective buyers. Don't expect them to be returned because often they are not. Be certain that these photos present your Cob in a good, but honest, light. I like to receive a photo from the side and one straight on that shows the legs well.

I always request a videotape. Oftentimes, the seller hasn't made one yet, and I have the opportunity to let them know what I would like to see. I ask for a few minutes of the horse running and trotting freely in the corral or pasture. Then I request that the animal be held and taped slowly from both sides as well as front and back, clearly showing the legs. After that, if the animal is halter broken, I have the person tape the horse being walked directly toward the camera and away from the camera, and then a repeat of this trotting. If the horse is broken to ride and/or drive I request a few minutes of this also. It sounds a bit compulsive, but this shows the animal very completely and allows the potential buyer to get a full picture of your horse or pony. **Don't** send 90

minutes of videotaping disasters! A few minutes should tell the buyer what they want to know. Edit your tape if possible to include just a few minutes of the essentials and exclude the inevitable "OOPS, I didn't realize that I walked across the pasture with the tape running, documenting the ground and my shoes" scenario. Don't include your horse standing around covered with dirt chewing on the fence. We all know that a bored Cob will find something with which to amuse himself, but eating the barn probably isn't a great advertising point.

Again, request that your videotape be returned, but don't necessarily expect it. Don't charge people for the tapes or take deposits. Chalk the expense up to advertising costs. We were once charged a \$20 deposit on a video which we then returned yet never got the deposit back. A bit irritating to say the least. We request the return of our stallion video on Megastar, but let the people know that they are welcome to keep it if they choose to breed their mare(s) to him.

When the buyer decides that your animal is the one he/she wants, insist that a veterinary exam be performed. This protects you from bad publicity if there is a problem or complaint later. Use a neutral vet not your regular one with whom you do Happy Hour. Usually, when buying an animal, we have our vet get us a referral in the area of the seller for a neutral vet whom we then pay to examine the horse. The buyer, usually, would pay for this exam, but the seller should do it if the buyer refuses, simply to protect himself.

I know that this goes against all good horse tradin' rules, but disclose any problems, past or present, to the buyer. You may lose the sale, or you may not, but you will save yourself and others a lot of heartache if you are up front and open about the animal. Things hidden tend to be revealed eventually, so honesty is definitely the best policy. Another note of insanity; we always give a full guarantee on our horses. If the new buyer is unhappy for any reason, barring an injury to the horse after it leaves our ranch, they can return it within a couple of months. (Buyer should be responsible for the transportation costs) It is extremely important to us not only to keep our good reputation intact but to make certain that our precious horses have the very best homes. Due to our full disclosure policy, we have yet to have an animal returned.

Don't forget to write a clear contract and get signatures. There are people I've talked to who are still trying to get their money from buyers, long after the horse has been shipped. Breeders can at least withhold the breeding certificate when payment of the stud fee is not forthcoming, but it is difficult to get a horse back, especially if it is 2,000 miles away. We, generally, insist on payment before pick-up. That is an individual choice, however.

This is certainly not an exhaustive view of the in's and out's of selling your horses or ponies, but I hope that these tips will be helpful to you either now or in the future as you market your stock.

It was the clinic's staff calling to inform me that my mare was foaling...no, wait!...had just foaled. With this very common, but always awe inspiring event, a little history was made in Arizona. On August 2, 1996, the first Section D Welsh Cob ever was born in the state of Arizona. In less than an hour, he was standing sturdily and surveying his new domain. One could only think that his ancestral instincts were in shock, "This sure doesn't look like Wales!" With his mother's famous bloodlines contributing his true black color and his father's (Minyffordd Megastar, Durango, CO) royal lines adding a superb shoulder and hind end, and with 15 happy people heralding his momentous arrival, "Desert Moon Premiere" still had but one thought..."Mom, feed me!"

*The following is an obituary on the Schockett's most loved Cob mare, SP. CH. *Lidgett Henrietta.*

*Supreme Champion *LIDGETT HENRIETTA (Llanarth Black Henry x Sydenham Jasmin) 1985-1996* To explain the loss of our foundation and first imported Cob mare cannot fully be put into words. On August 2, 1996, Henrietta finally succumbed to a

three year battle of illnesses, which had been triggered in part by several reproductive problems over the past six years. Henrietta was, by far, the most intelligent pony we have ever owned along with her heart and loyalty being second to none.

In her short, yet eventful, life she lived up to her phenomenal pedigree, such as the reputations of her Grandsires Llanarth Flying Comet and Derwen Supreme, as a many, many times Overall Supreme Champion. In Canada, she made a clean sweep of awards at the Pony Breeders Show, again at the Royal Winter Fair, and two years in a row she was honored with Supreme, and Reserve Supreme, in the prestigious "Old Mill" year end competition (currently the Champion of Champions competition- RAWF Show). In the U.S., she was Overall Supreme Champion at the NEWPCS Show every time shown and under dual U.K. and U. S. or Canadian judges. She was a Supreme Champion at NEWPA in Syracuse, New York (some of which were designated The American National Show), at every show. She was unanimously pinned here also by dual U. S. and U.K. judges, except at one show, where she was Supreme by one and Reserve Supreme by the 2nd. She also succeeded when shown at Quentin, PA (The Eastern National Show) as well as at the PennMaryDel Show and Elmira, N.Y. (previous NEWPA site). We had Henrietta trained to ride and drive by Larry Poulin, and she showed great potential as a combined driving pony. Early on, she successfully competed in pleasure driving and under saddle as well.

Her only foal, *Balsuma Highflyer* (by SP.CH. *Llanarth Trustful) was successfully shown as a foal at foot and was sold on to the west coast in Florence, Oregon as a weanling. He proved himself worthy by producing many lovely foals, especially Northfork's Lady Jane (who we bought sight unseen as a weanling) out of SP. CH. *Llanarth Nansi, whom we owned as a weanling and imported as a yearling and sold on at three to Oregon. As a yearling in 1995, Lady Jane was Overall Reserve Champion D Cob at NEWPCS and at two in 1996, was Grand Champion D at both NEWPCS and PennMaryDel (The American National Show). She was also honored by winning the Overall Show Supreme Champion at NEWPCS in 1996, and was Overall Youngstock Supreme Champion (Champion of Champions Qualifier-RAWF Show) at The American Nationals at PennMaryDel. So a piece of our dreams and Henrietta's legacy continue on.

Henrietta was the *matriarch* at home and left her mark with judges and spectators alike in the show ring. We were proud of her from the first day we saw her and that remains. We thank the Hopkin's Family from the Lidgett Stud, U.K. for allowing us to own this exceptional Cob mare. She has brightened our life and left us with many fond memories to cherish. To our family *Henrietta* was a much loved friend and family member who will not be forgotten.

Here's hoping you all not only survived but actually enjoyed the show season. We had a lively summer preparing for the Welsh shows we chose to attend this year. We went to Welsh of Wisconsin I and II and the Central Nationals in Tulsa combined with the Tulsa State Fair/OKWPS Show.

We decided to head north/east to Illinois to show against some different horses and meet some of the owners in that area. It was quite a drive, 1500 miles, from Durango to Roscoe, IL. We arrived in northern Illinois 5 days prior to the first show and got the horses settled into the Ledges Stables. George and Thalia Gentzel rolled out the welcome mat for us and treated us like old friends. It was a real pleasure to get the grand tour of their Yesteryear Farm and end the evening off with a wonderful BBQ.

I had a bit of an accident on the trail with Belladonna earlier in the summer; the path crumbled beneath her hooves and we started to fall off a 12 foot cliff. I bailed out and Belle caught herself at the last moment and climbed back onto the trail over my body, stepping on my stomach, pelvis, and knee. Nothing was broken, but I was very effectively out of riding until the end of August. Our trainer, David Bradbury, agreed to show our horses at WOW to help us out.

Friday came and David and *Minyffordd Megastar won all three of the Cob driving classes as well as the Cob Driving championship. I drove Mig in the Novice class with a full ring of ponies and buggies and took a very respectable 2nd. Three year old *Trefaes Belladonna did extremely well in the Cob English Pleasure and won the championship. Not bad for both horses in their first Welsh performance competition.

Saturday was Halter Day. Our two year-old filly, *HaighMoor Brenhines, won the fillies, 2 & Under class under both judges and Mig, the only stallion present, obviously won his Cob stallion class. Megastar won Grand Champion Cob under both judges with Brenhines Reserve under Mrs. Jo Curtis from the U.K. and *Lidgett Meredith Reserve under Mr. Bill Trapp from the USA. We showed later in the afternoon in the Supreme Champion class and Mig took double Reserve Supreme Champion, second to a Section B pony. Another successful day.

Sunday, Megastar won the Cob driving championship again, and Belle took Res. Ch. Cob English Pleasure, second to *Okeden Clover, owned by Fran Martin. All in all, it was a delightful show and we enjoyed getting to be friends with a number of Welsh owners. We left for home Monday, and aside from a week-long breakdown in Denver, had an uneventful trip.



In September, we went to Tulsa to the Central Nationals and OKWPS show. I'll cut this short. Brenhines won her young-stock classes under both judges (Mr. Wyn Jones of Wales and Mr. Norm Kalinski). Mig won the mature Cobs class under both. Mig won Grand Champion Cob under both judges with *Kentchurch

Chime Reserve, and then went on to become Tulsa State Fair/OKWPS Supreme Champion under Judge Kalinski. Saturday, I drove Megastar (at 10:15pm) in the 3 Cob Pleasure driving classes and won them, taking the Championship.

Sunday, I rode Belle in the Cob English Pleasure classes. She and I had ridden together about 6 times since our wreck in May and only about 4 times before that. **We survived.** The classes were 8 horses strong with very well trained Cobs. In the first class, we provided, once again, the entertainment as my saddle went under Belle's stomach at the canter...me with it, naturally. So much for class one. I remounted, finished the class, and we removed my nice, fluffy, white saddle pad between classes. The saddle remained in place thereafter, and we took 2nd in the next two classes to *Kentchurch Chime. I felt like I had won back at least a fraction of my dignity. Fortunately, my body didn't begin to ache until later that day when I thought death was an imminent possibility and perhaps preferable to suffering! My next purchase will be an English saddle with a very wide tree.

So! How was your show season?

THE COB SALES by India Haynes

Now that the show season is basically over and the days are growing shorter, there is one final event in the Welsh calendar that all Cobs lovers from both sides of the Atlantic look forward to - the sales. In three days, a visitor can see many Cobs of varying quality and enjoy a large dose of colourful Welsh life. The weather is invariably cold and damp, but the bustle and atmosphere, not to mention a visit to the beer tent, will soon warm you.

As many as one thousand lots can go through the sale ring during the three days. It is a rich opportunity for the foreign visitor to see Cobs of varying breeding, ages, and quality. Sometimes, it is helpful to the new Cob fancier to see some "not so good" examples to illustrate what is correct and true to type.

A couple of years ago, I had the opportunity to see the sales from the vendor's side which was enlightening. The sales experience begins in August. Breeders must submit their entries for the sales. This allows time for the extensive catalogue to be prepared. It also allows the sellers to prepare their lots (animals for sale). Not all the lots listed actually go forward. Some get sold privately prior to the sale; some sellers change their minds, and then, of course, there are those animals that choose to go lame or cough the day of the sale.

In 1993, I helped Milton Jones take the yearling colt Minyffordd Democrat to the sales. He had the colt in and fed and blanketed him for several weeks. By sales day, the colt was looking fat and sleek. Shoes were put on and he looked show ready. The Thursday before the sale, I helped get the colt ready. This lovely colt had the most tolerant disposition, considering he had not been handled all that much, and he was a real lamb to stand for bathing, mane and tail pulling, and clipping. He was trimmed as if for a show (see the NACC article on Cob turnout). That night, I cleaned the stallion bridle, paying careful attention to the brass fittings.

Friday: We set off in the car for Builth Wells. The sales kind of build to a climax on Monday, so there are an *awful* lot of undistinguished colt foals going through on Friday. Mind you, you can learn a lot from looking at them. There are many performance types as well. Prices normally reflect the quality of the stock. Occasionally, something very modest looking goes for big money, but rarely the other way around. When you see something extremely spiffy, it really stands apart. I did see many Cobs

of all ages that had performance potential.

Saturday: We set off again, this time in truck and trailer with the colt. We arrived at Builth where parking arrangements for lorries can only be described as *innovative*. We unloaded the colt and passed through the gates where he was "stickered" with his lot number, and we led him to his box.

There were people everywhere looking at anything with four legs. When I led the colt down, observers checked his number and looked in the catalogue to see who he was. Then people asked me to run him or questioned me about him. We got him to the box, spiffed him up a bit, and then led him out for a while. If you like watching people and/or horses, the sales are the place for you. There are horses trotting *everywhere*; in hand, under saddle, in carts - everywhere. There are foals dancing about, some of which I am sure have never been led before. There are stallions charging up and down the walk ways. I can not believe that no one is seriously hurt at these events as it is all a little hectic - but wonderful.

We left the colt for a bit and walked around the boxes to check out the other lots, and then we went down to watch some lots go through the sale ring. As a group, the standard of the lots going through on Saturday was noticeably improved. We spent most of our time walking around the collecting ring - which is not for the faint hearted. There were many fractious Cobs in a small space with many people and lots of noise. I saw just about everyone in the Welsh Cob world that I have ever met. The choice viewing spot of the sales is at the top row of the standing bleachers where you can look over into the collecting ring as well as see the lots go through the sales ring.

There is considerable strategy in dealing at the sales. Sellers and buyers alike treat the whole affair with plenty of cynicism. The standard of turnout of the lots varied from the just plucked out of the field - or off the mother- to the most impeccable turnout imaginable.

The time came to get the colt out and take him down to the ring. We set off about forty lots before his (about an hour). This way everyone got to view him outside the collecting ring and see him move if they wanted. I had several people come up to me as I was holding him to ask questions about him. As you work your way up to the indoor collecting ring, you see people come back and look, go away and confer, come back and pick up his feet, etc. It is quite fascinating to watch. With two or three lots to go, we started down an alley made of canvas screens that were about ten feet high. This tended to heighten the sensitivity of most of the youngsters so they came into the ring very animated.

My previous experience of horse sales was Goffs Bloodstock in Ireland which is a sedate affair. One quiet guy leads the yearling around, and everyone quietly bids. Not so here! In true Welsh style, the horses are led by one person for a lap before being passed off to another person who isn't out of breath. All the while, the pony or Cob is being chased and shuffled and hissed at to get its tail up by a crew (The sales catalogue states "The use of PLASTIC BAGS in the Sale Ring in any Shape or Form is BANNED"). All this in a dinky ring with Mr. Russell, Baldwin, or Bright loudly acknowledging the bidding. It is *quite* an experience. A great deal of energy is put into fizzing up the animal, and then, suddenly, the hammer falls, it's over, and the horse is led away.

After we presented the colt and the bidding was complete, I led the colt out of the ring and waited about to see if the

purchaser came up to him. We led him back to the box, and the job was done. He was now the property of the high bidder. We took his bridle off, put on a headcollar, and left him to be collected by the new owner. We found out the next day who had purchased him. We went back to the ring, watched the rest of the lots go through, and went home with an empty trailer.

Sunday: There were no sales as this was the day everyone went visiting. We stayed at Minyffordd as the Jones' had people coming to look at their Cobs.

Monday: Back on the road to Builth Wells. We followed the same path, first stopping at the boxes to have a look around, and pausing quite often to chat. This is the final big social/Cob event of the year. We then headed down to the sales ring. Monday is the day when the better/higher priced lots usually go through. We spent the whole day viewing the Cobs, looking up their names, and talking to Cob people. By about half past four in the afternoon I was starting to get a little overwhelmed after seeing almost one thousand Cobs go through the ring, more than there are in all the United States! We headed home.

If you decide to attend the sales to buy, do your homework and study the individual animal and its breeding before it enters the ring. With skillful production, a Cob may appear in the sales ring quite differently than in the collecting ring. If you are nervous about bidding (which may be warranted due to the speed at which it takes place, the acoustics, and the occasional phantom opposing bidder), you can commission someone to bid for you, setting a predetermined top price. It is a good idea to set a price limit on the lot you desire so you don't get carried away. If you are going to bid, get a bidder's number in advance. A few years ago, two high priced lots were "sold" to someone who vanished, leaving everyone in a mess. Use common sense in your ringside behavior. The cliché of waving to someone across the ring and finding yourself the unexpected owner of some foal is repeated annually. Messieurs Russell, Baldwin, and Bright may be nice guys, but they lack jocularly in this sort of situation. If you can not resist and decide to bid on a lot, there are plenty of shippers on hand who can help you get your purchase home. The Russell, Baldwin, and Bright company is more than happy to help you with exporting. In addition to the October sales (this year's dates: October 18, 19 & 21), they also put on a spring sale the week after the Glanusk show (around May 12). The following recipe has been used at Gregynog since 1965.
It is a traditional Welsh bread.

GREGYNOG BARA BRITH

- 1 CUP MIXED FRUIT
- 1 CUP SUGAR (GRANULATED)
- 2 CUPS SELF RAISING FLOUR
- 1 EGG
- 1 CUPFUL OF STRONG TEA

Soak fruit & sugar in tea overnight. Add egg & flour & mix well. Pour into a 1 lb. loaf tin and bake 300degrees about 1 hour. Serve thinly sliced with butter.



Gregynog is an arts centre for the Universities of Wales. Set in many acres of beautiful woodland, the house dates back to the 17th century although most of it has been rebuilt more recently. Our houseguests who come over for the Welsh Cob Sales usually end up walking through the grounds at some stage during their visit, falling in love with the woods, gardens and unusual trees and plants.

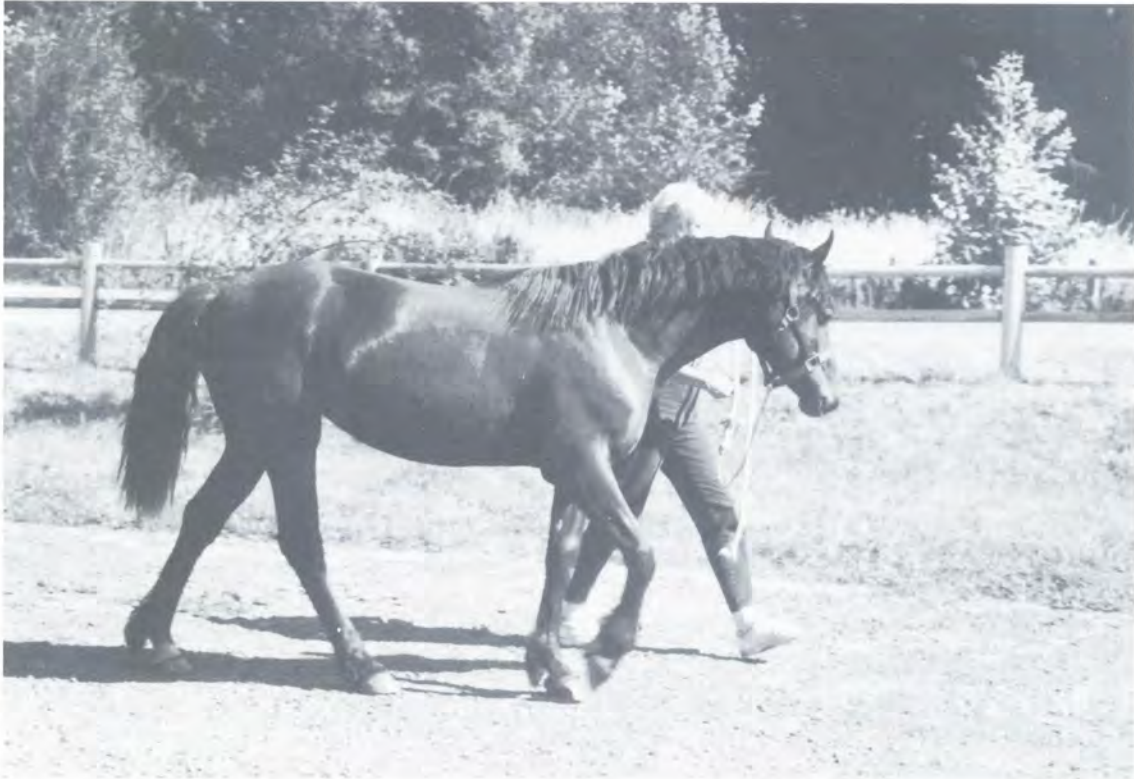
