It has meant a great deal to me (Bonnie) in particular as I sat hour after hour at my computer organizing everything, to know that there truly is a great group of people out there cheering us on and willing to support us in any way that they can to make this publication a success. We also appreciate the many new subscriptions and renewals that have come in recently. Keep up the good work!

On the subject of subscriptions; if you look at the mailing label on the back of this newsletter, you will notice above your name a subscription expiration date. If you compare that to your last issue, there should be two issues added on to your subscription if you are not a new subscriber. If you were a subscriber as of Fall 94 and do not have two issues added on, please contact me. We really tried to get everyone up to date, but sometimes things get by us. *Please note on your mailing label; if your subscription is expired, we hope that you will enjoy this final complimentary copy so much that you will renew your subscription.* One small change concerning the fees: subscriptions for Canada are \$25 in the form of a bank draft payable in U.S. funds. UK subscriptions, \$27, must be paid in the form of U.S. dollar also. I know that this may be a bit of an inconvenience, but once we pay to exchange foreign currency, we are losing money on the subscriptions. If we have already received your payment in another form, don't worry about it. We'll accept what you have sent.

We have an idea that you may find interesting. If we increase the subscriber's list for NACC, we will have the money to continue to improve the quality of each issue, or maybe even afford the improvements that we have already made! Many of you are selling your ponies and cobs to first time C or D owners, or NACC non-subscribers. Wouldn't it be wonderful to give them a gift of a copy of the NACC along with their beautiful new horse? If you will send us their

name, address, phone number, and \$5.00 we will send them out the most recent issue with a note saying that this is a complimentary copy given by You! Such a deal!

Next edition Carrie Vilelli will be writing an article on photographing your equine friend for advertising in a magazine (or newsletter, as the case may be). Do not overlook this article! She is very experienced in this area, and you will find her ideas and hints invaluable in providing publishers with printable photos. In the meantime...(you knew this was coming, didn't you), we have a few important suggestions for you. If you want the best quality reproduction possible, send us slides or negatives. Black and white photos are better than color, simply because you can see how your picture will look when translated to black and white. (a brown horse in a brown barn will disappear when it is printed in grayscale, and a white horse against a light sky will look like two eyeballs suspended in thin air). Do not label your photos on the back with felt pen! It bleeds onto underlying pictures and we spend a lot of time touching up these photos. Use ball point pen with regular ink. Photograph early a.m. or late p.m. with full sun on the camera side of the horse to minimize shadows; they print black. Avoid white clothing if possible, white intensifies and keeps us from being able to adequately lighten shadowed areas. Take just a moment to look at the photos in this newsletter with these guidelines in mind. See for yourself what works, and what doesn't. We know this seems a bit compulsive of us, but we want your photos and ads to be as wonderful as you have envisioned them. (If you send in photographs by professional photographers or articles that were printed in another publication or newspaper, we need a written release to reprint those items.)

We do this entire newsletter on a computer (yes, Satan does live in computers), and we load the data onto a Syquest disk and take it to the printer. As your ads, articles, and letters come in, they are entered into the computer. Once all the information is in, we're ready to print. Here is the point, we're serious about our deadlines. We have a firm commitment to getting this newsletter back on schedule. The printer takes 7 to 10 working days to complete the printing process. If we get the info into their hands by the 2nd or 3rd of the month, you will have it in your hands by the end of the month. *(continued on page 47)*

As the mare she chose turned out not to be in foal, it was decided that the trade would include her full sister's '95 foal... so the arrangements were made. My husband, George, has ***Okeden Clover** on lease from our friend, Fran Martin to raise a ***Brynarian Briton** foal for driving. Of course, when daughter Molly came home from Colorado last August for the Welsh of Wisconsin show she HAD to show Clover both english and western, plus halter. Our young friend, Jennifer Walter, swept the Junior Exhibitor English Pleasure-and we all had a great time with a Welsh of suitable size.

Then came the American National at Tulsa and Clover was Grand Champion Cob in the OKWPS show under Mrs. Costanzo and Reserve Grand in the American Nationals under Mr. Peter Jones. In addition to winning all the adult ridden Cob pleasure classes (english and western), Clover won the open English pleasure over all sections and placed over fences.

When the WPCSA yearend points were announced, we were all overwhelmed to find Clover to be the National Champion in Cob English Pleasure, Adult Exhibitor, and Reserve at Halter. Molly was Co-Champion in Adult Hunt Seat Equitation. Welsh of Wisconsin yearend results were comparable with the highly contested Open Performance Championship an added bonus! Clover also took top Midwest Welsh Breeders honors in Pleasure and Reserve in High-Point Hunter, the first Cob to rank in their system. Clover's dam, **Okeden Gorse** thus became WOW Cob Performance Dam of the Year and MWBI Reserve High-Point Dam. **Derwen Telynor**, Clover's sire, was also WOW Cob Performance Sire of the Year.

In October, Clover and Fran (and Fran's sister) participated in the WOW overnight and ride in the beautiful Kettle Moraine State Forest of Wisconsin. Fran should have an award of her own for "most camping gear stowed in a compact car." I also

rode Clover at Rock Cut State Park near us in Illinois. Now we are eagerly awaiting her foal at the end of June! This has been a great boost to my husband's morale as he has been sedentary from November through February with a blood clot in his lung followed by two fractured vertebrae.

Molly's intercollegiate riding led us to observe Cobs across the country in 1994. She won the zone titles, team and individual over fences, at Calabasas, CA. In April we stayed with Stephanie Abronson and admired her Cob crosses as well as seeing ***Derwen Denmark** at the Santa Inez Carriage Classic and ***Leyeswick Brenin** and his court at Janina Owens. Then when Molly was individual Stock Seat Champion at the Intercollegiate National Finals in Texas in May we drove back by way of Baton Rouge to visit an old friend, Debra Landrem, and her section Cs.

Hopefully 1995 will find our family at more shows and Cob farms. Welsh of Wisconsin is excited to be hosting two WPCSA Gold rated shows with Cob halter and performance divisions at the excellent Ledges Complex in Roscoe, Illinois (just off I90) August 18-19 and 19-20. Marsha Himler and Bill Trapp will be judging. Dressage classes are also offered.

WOW is also hosting WPCSA bronze divisions in three GLMHPA shows on June 4, July 30, and Sept. 1. This year Cobs and Half-Welsh may show in bronze performance classes with the Sections A and B, and adults and juniors are combined. This is a far more workable situation when the class schedule is limited. Cobs do have their own halter classes, however.

*Brynarian Briton will again be representing Cobs in the Welsh, Liberty, and Stallion Exhibitions at the huge Midwest Horse Fair in Madison, Wisconsin on April 22-23.

Dear Cob Connection,

Glenhaven has plenty to brag about this year. Last February, I was approached by the producer of **HORSEWORLD** and invited to bring some of my ponies and cobs to be featured on their program. Trying to clean up animals in torrential conditions was a major task. Nevertheless, we turned out our horses and certainly impressed Larry Mahan and crew. The program is seen by over 3 million viewers, and I received a staggering response. **Derwen Denmark**, the imported 6 year old black stallion, was ridden, jumped, and driven to show his versatility. **Derwen Tequila** performed a dressage display, and **Powys Valley Tamara**, although having been with the trainer for only 2 weeks, looked terrific shown western.

The Section A’s were represented by the striking 2 year old bay colt, **Vimpenny Sweet Sultan**, along with the beautiful buckskin **Forlan Hello Dolly**, who was a prolific winner in Wales. The gelding, **Archway’s Mistique**, was shown by his young rider for the first time for the filming. I am confident that this publicity can only improve the public’s awareness of these wonderful versatile animals.

We were hardly over our film debut when I was invited to represent the stallion **Llanarth True Briton** for a *Breyer* commercial. Apparently, Vimpenny Sweet Sultan was the closest in color, and, with the help of

brown hair spray on his white sock and snip as well as a stencil of Briton's crescent moon on his forehead, he seemed a good color match. Naturally, I did explain to the film company that Sultan was a Section A and Briton was a Section D. So apart from us priveledged few who can know the difference, I've promised never to tell.

A new training and boarding facility owned by Glenhaven has opened in Norco, Ca. Although it is open to all breeds, it will be the home of the 7 Glenhaven stallions and will provide a facility for live cover as well as A.I. It offers a jumping arena and a driving track along with indoor and outdoor stabling.

Glenhaven is also delighted with the arrival of three beautiful foals, two of which were by Derwen Denmark. One is out of **Derwen Gentle Lady**, another is a black colt that was out of **Hengwm Hettie** (sold to Kansas), and the other is a chestnut filly who is available for sale. She will mature to around 15hh, and her markings include four white socks and a stripe. Blessed with a exquisite head, her bloodlines make her an ideal foundation mare.

Ceulan Samswn's first foal out of **Ceulan (J) Bubble** defies description. It is a chestnut colt whose markings include four white socks, a blaze, and a flaxen mane and tail. He is an outstanding foal. Not surprising when you consider that Samswn was 1st in the Royal Welsh Foal Class which makes him the only Section A stallion in the USA to have done so. Bubbles, the WPCSA English Pleasure Champion, was also Reserve Champion Section A Mare in the 1994 Western Nationals. **Glenhaven Welsh Byron**, as the colt foal is called, would do Dr. Wynne Davies proud, and the quality of this foal is striking. He is offered for sale and could only enhance any breeding program.

At the first major show of the season, the California Spring Classic, Derwen Denmark and Powys Valley Tamara both excelled. Denmark won two open classes in

the driving section as well as the WPCSA Pleasure Driving and Show Hack classes, thereby winning the High Point Single Whip Award presented by the Lyndecker Fresians. Tamara, with only 7 weeks training, took 1st in the Welsh Pony & Cob English Pleasure as well as WPCSA English Pleasure Working. She stood 2nd to Denmark in the Show Hack Class.

This year Derwen Denmark will be covering the following 6 section D mares: Derwen Tequila, Derwen Gentle Lady, **Tuscani Diamante**, Hengwm Hettie, Powys Valley Tamara, and **Nocturne's Abigail**. Of these, two foals have been reserved and, to date, I am awaiting notice on a third. Ceulan Samswn will cover Ceulan (J) Bubble and **Ceulan Sirius (by Trefaes Taran)**. Briton and Gwenno were bred by Thomas I. Davis in British Columbia. I imported them in 1985. Gwenno is owned by Candy Banks, and she is for sale to someone interested in pursuing her driving career. Sam is owned by Joanne Larsen of Elgin, IL. The whip is Klaus Biesenthal. (see article page 27)

At the American Heritage CDE this past August, Cobs certainly were in view. I drove Briton, Klaus drove Gwenno and Sam, and Sherry Haviga brought out her Briton son, "**Glacier's Bit of Briton**" for his first time. It was really fun to see!

WELSH PONIES OF COB TYPE

A Matter of Interest Concerning the Percentage Rules in Canada:

As most of you are aware, The Welsh Pony and Cob Society of Canada has very precise percentage rules that apply to all Section C and Section D Welsh. These rules apply whether the animal is Canadian bred or imported. They were brought into effect several years ago by the Canadian membership to protect the purity of the Cob bloodlines while there were so few of them in North America. While some people feel the percentage rule has inhibited the growth of the Section C in Canada, there are some breeders who are producing 100% stock, and it is possible to import Section C's and D's that conform to the Canadian guidelines. It requires research into the bloodlines of the animals in question.

The percentage refers to the amount of Cob blood the Section C or D has in its pedigree. There are two points you must always keep in mind when researching C or D pedigrees:.

1) One of the parents must be 100% for the offspring to be registerable and 2) You must go back at least 3 generations in the pedigree to be able to determine the percentage of the animal.

It is very encouraging to see that some Americans have shown an interest in applying percentages to their Section C's and D's. A word of caution, however: the fact that both Sire and Dam are registered C or D does not mean that the offspring is automatically 100%. It might not even be eligible for registration in Canada (remember the rule stating that one parent must be 100%).

In order to avoid disappointment when applying for Canadian registration, research your pedigrees first. Make sure your 100% C or D is really that. The following examples of pedigrees will give you a better understanding of how the percentages work:

“If You Build It, Will They Come?”

NACC Editorial

Every show manager has an anxious wait between the time the class lists go out and when the entries begin arriving. What is it that makes a competitor decide on one show rather than another? When competitors have to drive so far to the show and then spend even more money to compete, what gives one the edge? The first question an exhibitor asks is “Who’s judging.” But what is it that makes them send in their entries? After asking competitors and judges around the country and in the UK what makes them decide to attend a specific show, this was what the response was:

Location, Location, Location: Well, you can’t change geography, but you can help by allowing good road access into the showgrounds and and by providing detailed directions in the showbooks or class listings. “I don’t mind driving further to a good facility.” This was a common statement made by many of the people questioned. They wanted a big arena or show ring with excellent footing along with the need for *safe stabling*. This was a significant requirement, especially for stallions and youngstock. The ring needs a good, functioning PA system that can be clearly heard throughout the arena. A clear PA system is also readily welcomed in the stabling area.

Food: I am not joking. For competitors who are at a three-day show, a good food booth is essential. If someone has driven from, say, Maine, they don’t have a clue where the nearest deli is. They want hot coffee, cold

sodas, and, preferably, something edible. Lord knows that Cob people will eat almost anything, but I had a burger at one show that I couldn’t get a stray dog to eat. The other group of people interested in food are judges. I have spoken to more than a few judges from the UK who commented on how they came very near to starving to death at US shows. I have actually seen judges wandering the aisles looking for food when there was no food booth. We won’t be able to get the really top people to judge if we offer no hospitality.

Stewarding: The judge will judge at the speed they judge. It is the steward who will keep the show going. By working with an efficient announcer, the show will have a much greater chance of moving on smoothly and more efficiently. The judges need to educate the stewards before the show on how they would like the classes to be run. I have been told not to trot my Cob into the ring, then told it was OK, but was then stopped and told to walk again. This was at a WPSCA Gold Rated show. I did not import my Cobs from Wales and then travel from Maine to compete so I could walk them into the ring.

Results: I have talked to people who have spent hundreds of dollars to go to a show and were also very successful at these shows, but they complained that the only people who know about the wins were the people at the show and their mothers. Show secretaries need to send the results to any publication that will have them. By doing this, it shows that the show management is on the ball and thereby reinforces the show’s name in a positive light months after the show is over. It will also solidify competitors plans for showing in the next year.

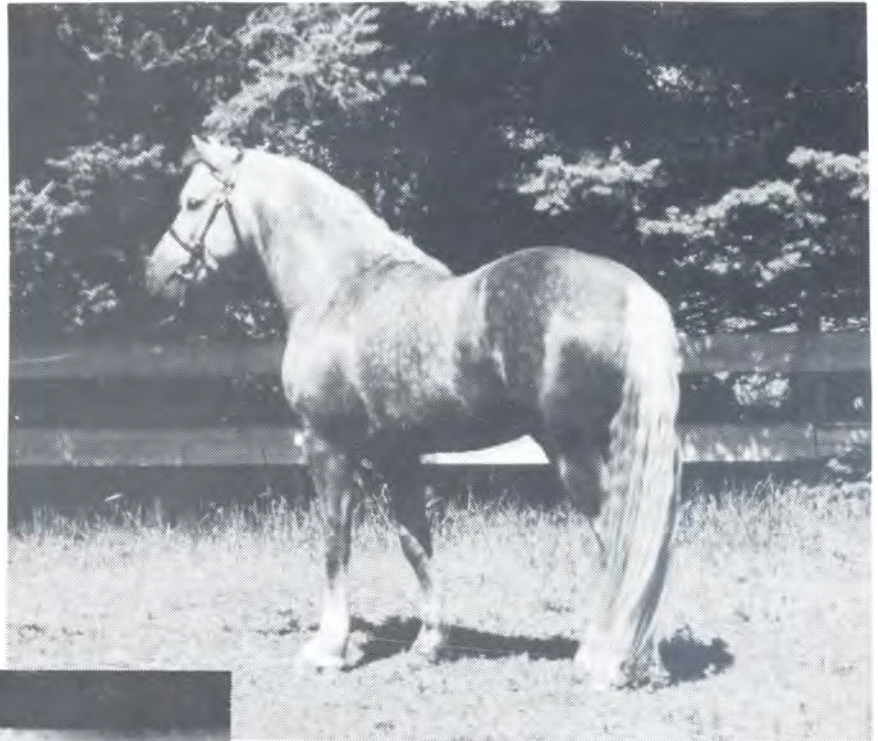

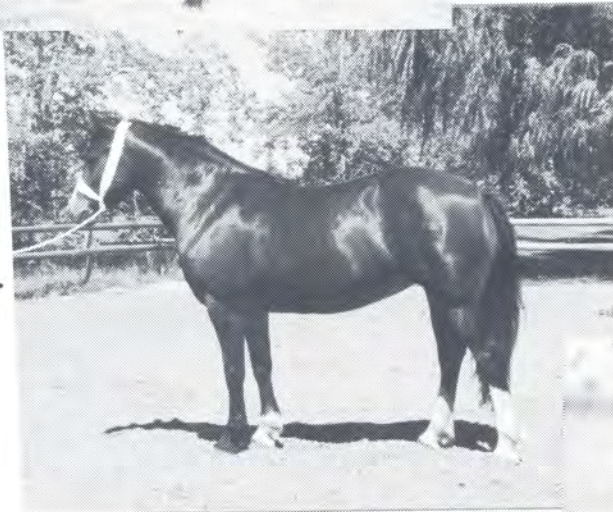

**St. James Farm Combined Driving
Event II
Warrenville, IL, August 19 & 20, 1995**

High temperatures and humidity failed to deter competitors at the St. James Farm Combined Driving Event II in Warrenville, Illinois, on August 19th & 20th. Twenty-six turnouts competed in training, preliminary and intermediate divisions. Barbara Chapman of Metamora, Michigan took the blue ribbon in the intermediate division, single horse class; Klaus Biesenthal of Elgin, Illinois took the blue in the intermediate division, multiple horse class.

Against competitors with international-level experience, Biesenthal dominated the Intermediate Division, with his pair of Cobs. On the marathon course, which is a test of stamina, endurance, and agility, Biesenthal assured his win by turning in a penalty score less than half that of the closest competitor. Overall scores for the competition saw Biesenthal in first with 145 points, Lance Thomas of St. Charles, IL with a score of 253.2, and Jack Stewart with 378.1.

David Sullivan, the course designer, said that he designed the obstacles in section E of the marathon course to test the ingenuity and creativity of the whips. He said, "As I was designing the course, I thought about what would be fun for me to drive. I like a lot of options—there's 20 different ways to skin a cat. Several competitors said that they found a few of the obstacles tighter than they had expected. Bonnie Sheahan summed up their thoughts when she said: "When you wrap your rear wheel around a tree, it takes a little longer to get out of the exit gate." Howard Kietzke, of Franksville, Wis., who took the blue ribbon in the preliminary division, single horse class agreed, saying, "I got hung up in the second obstacle for a moment, but three and four were open with lots of options."

Taking the blue ribbon in the preliminary division, multiple horse class was Mary Ruth Marks of Verona, Wisconsin, with a score of 190.5. She said, "Going from training level at the American Heritage CDE earlier this month to preliminary at St. James Farm was a big step for us. The obstacles, tighter than expected, were a real challenge. The course itself was just awesome!"

Competitors noted how smoothly the show ran and were quite complimentary of the organizers and the volunteers. "You could see the hours that were put into preparing for the event", said one of the competitors. However, they saved their superlatives for the St. James farm facilities and the marathon course. Several of the drivers and their grooms commented about the natural beauty of the Marathon Course. One said, "Section A of of the marathon was one of the prettiest drives that I have been on; it was like being in a park." Dolores Rohloff, groom for Suzanne Smith, commented that "...we're so lucky to have a place like this for events."

LAST BUT NOT LEAST... **THE TAIL END**

India Haynes

The tail is the most neglected aspect of the Cob in the show ring. The reasons are obvious. You head to the stables armed with your trusty pulling comb, you put the Cob on cross ties and you walk around to the hind end and are faced with an enormous bush. It is wiry, matted, and looks to be home to small animals - so where do you start?

Start with an idea of what you are hoping to achieve. If you have a Cob with a sloping croup and weak back end, not even Vidal Sassoon is going to help you. But if you want to flatter the hindquarters and show off the gaskins and hocks, judicious grooming, pulling, and bandaging will bring rewards.

First off, big hair is out for Cobs. Forget the

Camaro-head look for manes or tails. In

the old country, they are shown neat

and workmanlike; a style we should

emulate because it is flattering. Look

at photos, if you can, of well turned

out Cobs. Look at the Cobs you think

have really super back ends, then notice

how the tails are prepared. The overall

effect should be tidy, tailored, and com-

pletely natural. To achieve the total look

takes time. You can't go in the day

before a show and expect to sort out a full, untouched

tail. The best plan is to pull a few hairs each day over

a long period of time. I start on manes and tails 4-6

weeks before a show. I take a couple of swipes each day

and the horse doesn't protest too much.

If you are starting from scratch, particularly if you are not an experienced hair puller, as a matter of safety it is advised to place bales of hay behind the horse or do this project over a half door or trailer tailgate. Unless the tail is extremely disgusting, I recommend that you don't wash it first because the dirtier it is the better grip you can get on the hair when you pull. You do not necessarily need to comb out the tail, for it all depends on how matted it is. Pulling a clean tail, especially one that has been conditioned and Show-sheened, is like trying to catch a greased pig. Begin by pulling the hairs from underneath the dock on either side. Take a few hairs at a time and wrap



them around a pulling comb or your fingers (wrapping with adhesive tape will prevent hair cuts) and pull gently, but swiftly. Move along quickly and keep moving down the dock. Don't pull in one spot but go down each side and stand back and assess. This may be enough for one session. To shorten the length of the tail you will need to pull the hairs that are too long from the bottom. Use the pulling comb or fingers and pull out a few at a time. If you have a tail that is not very thick, you can use a stripping comb to carefully break off the extra length. Do not use scissors or you will end up with the Dutch Boy look. It is important to have the bottom fringed so as to look natural. If it is cut off, it will look too much like a riding pony.

The use of the tail bandage really helps to enhance the look you are trying to achieve. Dampen the tail and wrap with a stockingnet type bandage, not too tightly, all the way down the dock. Do not leave it on overnight or put on a wet bandage. Put it on the morning before your class at the show, and don't forget to take it off before going into the ring. To remove it, just pull down from the top of the dock with both hands.

Once you have pulled and shaped the tail, regular maintenance will see you throughout the show season. Remember, any time you remove hair, you are removing protection from the animal.

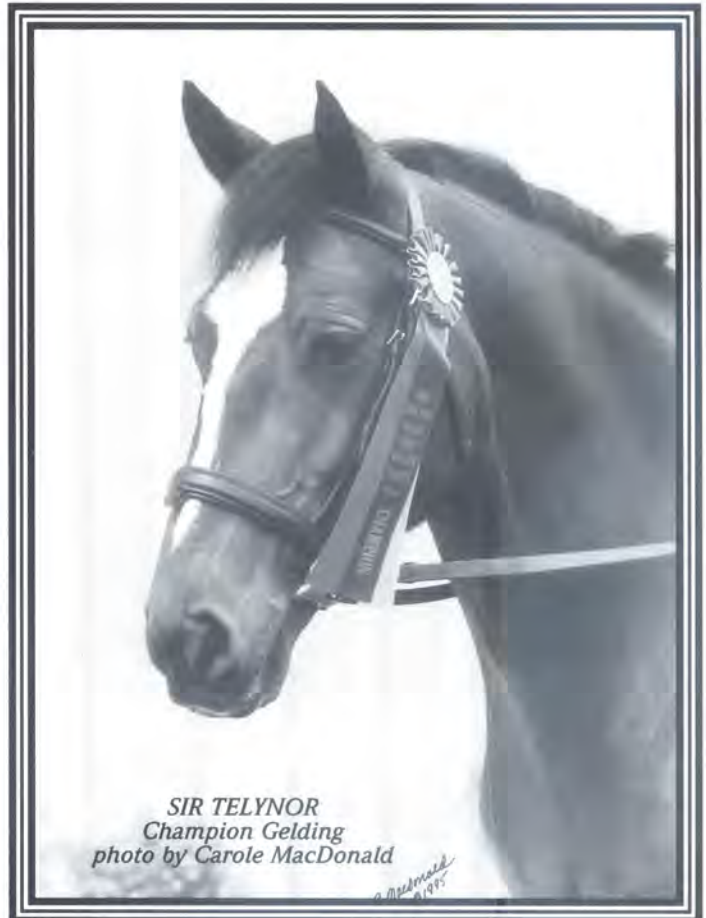

After many phone conversations and research, it was decided that 18 ounces per shoe would give us the freedom to shoe our horses and ponies in a manner which would give them the support that they need in the size that they require. *Mrs. Jane Forbes Clark*, president of the AHSA, in response to Jean's request for the important rule change took the request to the AHSA and was successful on our behalf. Our Society guidelines have also been changed to match the AHSA rules. Thank you so very much Jean, Jane, and the rest of our board of directors of the WPCSA! We appreciate you!
