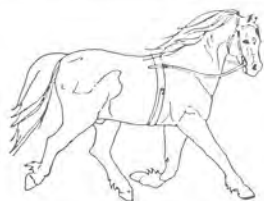

WELSH COBS IN AUSTRALIA

In the 16th century, a Welsh poet wrote that a stallion should have the outlook and disposition of a stag, a dished face, nostrils wide and open like dancing in his head, his ears small and fine and a coat like new silk. He should be able to trot on a stoney road so that fire sparks fly from his shoes and to jump like a deer, and carry weight on his back.

He must have had in mind a Welsh pony or Cob, but this sort of quality is not always evident in a Cob. Perhaps a dished head is not necessarily desirable but the rest should be possible if we use only the best of bloodlines.

In Australia we are small in population compared with the USA but we have a Welsh Pony and Cob Society that prints roughly 1500 newsletters quarterly, and is held in respect throughout the Western world. We have kept very close ties with Wales and have followed closely behind the WP&CS UK with all rules and recommendations, so we do not have problems with the heights of A's and B's. Our A's are not exceeding 12 hh (if they grow over they stay A's for breeding but cannot be shown), and our B's are any height up to 13:2 hh, but must have at least one B parent (cannot be an overgrown A).

Volume 1 of our stud book was not printed until 1973 so we are quite young. Entries are now being accepted for Vol. 8. Cobs had been imported in the early part of this century but records were not usually kept. More recently, in the mid seventies, a Section C stallion was imported to Victoria, TYSSUL CARDI, by Lyn Cwmcoed out of Meiarth Llinos (by Gredington Oswald). Unfortunately he died in an accident

at an early age, and although small, he left some useful progeny in Australia.

Section C mares were few on the ground so Caeresgob Posy came out in foal to Ffoslas ap Braint and just after arrival, foaled a nice chestnut colt, called Acheron Ffossi ap Braint (iiu), now a well-known stallion. Synod Georgie Girl came out with Synod Gay Girl at foot (by Synod William) and in foal again to him. The foal was a colt called Wingana Justin Time who was successful in the showing. The dun mare Trichrug Lili followed (by Brenin Dafydd), and then Saltmarsh Amanda (by Lyn Cwmcoed) went to Tasmania. All are still alive and producing quality stock.

NEWS FROM THE U.S.

Oregon's first 100% Section C foal arrived! (She first arrived last June when she was in utero of her dam GLENDOWNER LIBERTY.) Named FIELDSTONE GLORY, her sire is *MERION-ETH MERLYN. Glory is owned by Christine Tillotson, Fieldstone Farm, Pleasant Hill, Oregon.

About 65 miles west of Fieldstone Glory's home, another Section C filly arrived. NORTH FORK'S TICKLE YOUR FANCY, a big boned chestnut with a blaze and stockings, is the newest addition at the farm of the Holcombe Family. Fancy is the last offspring of Sec. C, Ch. *SYNOD GLADSTONE and, and his only filly, out of Sec. A mare, PENRHYN NUTCRACKER. Unlike her sire, who was bay, or her dam, who is also bay, Fancy arrived as a chestnut! Carol has captured her on video from her first hour of life. So, how many hours of baby video do we have now, Carol? Carol also enclosed a photo of Sec. D HASTENING MIRAGE being driven by trainer Karin Ullian. Mirage's first foal, NORTH FORK'S NOBLE SQUIRE, is now a 3-y.o. and also with Karin for training. With the steady stream of cobs in her stable since last fall, Karin, is now fishing for just the right one for herself.

Oregon's second Welsh Warmblood is the most recent arrival.. Weighing in at 82 pounds, this handsome colt is by the Welsh Cob Brynarian Black Magic and out of T.B. Forward Lady, owned by Janet Heard and Jocelyn Wright, Cottonwood Creek Farm. (Janet and Jocelyn also produced Oregon's first Welsh Warmblood, Midnight Matinee.) With huge knees and hocks, this big guy is marked like his daddy with a sprinkle of hairs for his star and short hind socks. As to his color ??? here's a hint: he has a dorsal stripe. As to his name ??? (will Stormin' Norman? stick?) we'll find out later.

Anne and husband John Lamb traveled to Southern California in early April and visited the farms of Stephanie Abronson, Pony X Farm and Suzanne Glenn of Glenhaven Welsh Cob Stud. She returned home with a February issue of *The Horse Market*, touted as 'The Best Sales Magazine on the West Coast.' Suzanne and her stallion, DERWEN DASHING DUKE are pictured in color on the

The following excerpts are from the February issue of the Welsh newsletter *ACTION*.

There seems to be a lot happening with Cobs in spite of our depressed economy. More Cobs are currently competing in activities rather than merely being toys on the end of a lead rein, which is very en

couraging. The APSB North Social Group held their annual Study Pony Show at Oxley via Wangaratta on March 10, 1991. Eight C and D led classes were offered. The Dandenong and the Welsh Feature Show had excellent Cob entries and it was beautiful to see some new faces. We still haven't managed to overcome the problem of the Cobs coming on last thing in the afternoon. This was particularly annoying at Dandenong because disappointed spectators had gone home for tea after waiting all day to see Cobs.

A meeting was held January 8, followed by a barbecue and video evening at the home of Viola Myers in Kew. Enthusiasts arrived from both NSW and SA as well as, of course, from various parts of Victoria and the event was a great success. A pamphlet will shortly be available listing owners and breeding stock throughout Australia, plus containing advertising from various studs. This should prove to be invaluable resource material for newcomers looking for information as well as for established breeders looking to expand numbers or bloodlines.

From the Editor: A copy of The Welsh Cob 1991 Handbook was included in the materials sent by Sue Walsh. The handbook is an excellent example of breed information for a budding enthusiast. Maps locating the breeders of each region are displayed. And breeders list their stock, including height, color and registration # (although I would also like to see sire/dam). In full-page format, the photographs make a very favorable impression and the photocopied quality of the pages does not distract from its overall usefulness. A great idea, Sue!

Stud News: The Sec. C stallion WINGANA PARC GAFFER, was Supreme Harness Exhibit at Perth Royal Show last October. Since he also excels in dressage, some Thoroughbred mares have been sent to him hoping to breed a foal with his eye-catching movement.

In Victoria, ACHERON DALEN and ACHERON SEREN have both won several Championships in harness as well as winning in hand. Various youngsters of Cob breeding have recently been broken to harness and several should make their debut in either shows or combined driving next season.

Interstate sales have been booming. Sales to Western Australia include: BARNON JUST A MOMENT, purchased by Athol and Shirley Purchas; WINGANA PARC BRENHINES, SYNOD GEORGIE GIRL and NEIKA JULIAN going to new members Mr & Mrs LJ Thomas; WINGANA JUSTIN CASE, Sec. C, who was sold to Mrs. A Vanzetti; and ACHERON DANCER also going to a new home in WA.

BARNON BEAU GAMBLER produced all fillies including a black C, a bay from a TB mare, and a chestnut from an Arab.

Acheron has some wonderful foals by Redwood Derw (imp) including a rather special cream colt and is now eagerly awaiting the arrival from the UK of Llanina Merlyn (by Llanarth Lord Nelson). He is a black Cob colt travelling by sea and hopefully bypassing the Middle East war zone. Insurance doesn't cover torpedoes!

We had a pronounced shortage of big Cob mares so two bay mares, Trefaes Charm (by Trefaes Bach) and Trefaes Cymraes (by Hafrena Brenin), found their way to Victoria and a Cob filly arrived late in the seventies, Rhydlas Ramona, a chestnut by Farian Prince. So often things do not work out as planned and Charm is now dead, while Ramona has not been used much.

Meanwhile the boys carried the flag for Cobs. Brenin Pur (by Rhosfarch Frenin), a smallish bay foaled in 1968 left some nice mares and some purebred stallions to carry on the traditional bloodlines, before he died at an early age. Derwen Serenlllys (by Derwen Rosina's Last), born 1974, and Gerrig Arwyn (1974), by Hewid Cardi, both big and black, went to live in NSW. I suspect Arwyn never to have bred a purebred foal, but Serenlllys is now proving a very popular sire because of his size, colour and temperament. Most of his progeny are in harness, and one of Australia's representatives at the World Equestrian Championships at Stockholm last year qualified using a team mainly comprised of Cob/T.B. geldings by Serenlllys.



Welsh Cob/T.B. Crosses by DERWEN SERENLLYS

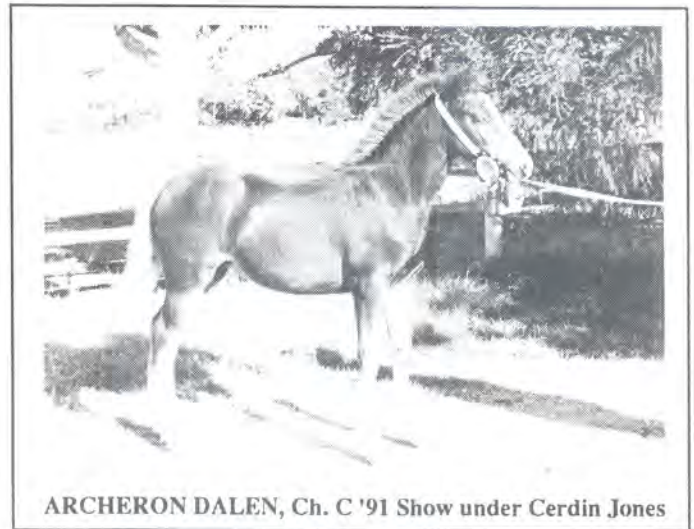
Redwood Derw (by Derwen Deryn Du) (1974) arrived around the same time and although small, has been used extensively, passing on his wonderful head and movement. One of the biggest to arrive was the palomino stallion Gwibedog Sportsman (by Derwen Llwynog) foaled in 1974. He has produced excellent athletic ride and jump Cobs and partbreds, often passing on his brilliant colour. There are lots of junior 'Sportmans' around, especially throughout Victoria. Llanarth Jack Flash, a well-bred good looking 15 hh chestnut by Nebo Black Magic has been little used because of geographical position, but will be shifting soon so we hope he will have lots of visiting 'wives'. Cymraes came out in foal to Hwylog Lancelot and produced Annan Lancelot who died before reaching full maturity.

In the 1980's it was exciting to see old Hewid Dafydd (by Cahn Dafydd) arrive from New Zealand, where his original

imported from Wales had passed on. Although foaled in 1965, he remains extremely lively. He arrived in Australia with an old mare, Broughton Gay Girl by Cream Bank (born 1968) who has bred a nice lot of foals to him. The attractive dark bay Sydenham Hawfinch (by Geler Cardi Model) went to Tasmania, together with another mare, Trevallion Bluebella, a chestnut by Cippyn Real Magic, both born in 1978. Oakhatch Carmen Campus, a big cream mare to Parc Dafydd arrived from the U.K. to reside in N.S.W. The Section C stallion, Grey's Sport (by Nebo Brenin) came to Victoria, but has only been lightly used to date. In Queensland, one enthusiast managed to import two well-bred chestnut Cob mares to give us new blood, but unfortunately there is no "D" stallion within the state. The mares are Llanarth Molly and Watling Rhosyn; Rhosyn has already had two colts by Ll. Jack Flash.

The nineties will hopefully be kind to Cob breeders and allow us to bring in some new stock. Already a bay Cob colt has flown to South Australia from England. He is Trevallion Comet's Last (by Tyhen Comet) and has been used over several mares already, as well as winning several Championships in the showing. A black colt, Llanina Merlyn (by Llanarth Lord Nelson) is also on his way from the U.K. to Victoria. We could do with a few more large mares but the expense of transporting them is fairly prohibitive. We have some of the strictest quarantine regulations in the world and it is very difficult to bring out mares in foal.

My own Cobs seem to sell best for harness and at present I think the main winners in harness in Victoria are Cobs that I have bred. Other breeders concentrate on selling quiet pleasure ponies/horses, or pony club eventers. It is thrilling to see the men getting keen on the Cobs—it looks far more masculine than owning a slender little Riding Pony. Our studbook is open to Foundation Stock, which have to be inspected by an Inspector/Judge from the list appointed by the Society. It takes four generations for female



ARCHERON DALEN, Ch. C '91 Show under Cerdin Jones

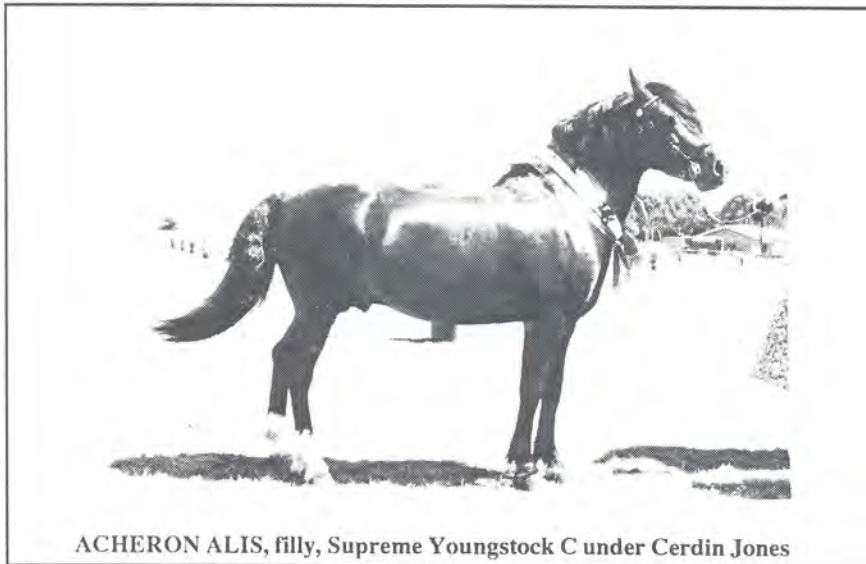
Cob progeny to reach purebred status, and all males are gelded along the way. Female progeny that does not pass inspection is put in the partbred register. We look for type, correct conformation and action.

Our Cob Promotion Group is requesting more classes for Cobs at prominent shows and we seek judges who are "Cob folk", not A and B breeders so that the correct type of Cob hopefully wins. I guess that in the current economic recession we suffer from the same problems as American Cob breeders—**AUSTRALIA - continued**

too few buyers prepared to pay the money that makes breeding financially viable. We do not seem to be getting prices as high as yours, but then we do not yet have the wide choice of bloodlines that are available in the USA. Nearly all stock in Australia is by one of the seven main imported Cob stallions. One stud makes use of C stallions to breed D's but I think this is a backward step. I think C's and D's are different and the bloodlines are best kept apart, although small D's can be used to breed C's at times (like Cippyn Red Flyer in Wales). I am Secretary of our Promotion Group and I would love to hear from anyone in America if they care to write.

Last year I was able to visit the U.K. for the Royal Welsh Show which was wonderful. My rush around to most of the Cob studs was thrilling, and I ended up at Llanarth where I bought Llanina Merlyn, a black colt. So now I have some friendly people in both England and Wales to write to, and already one Welsh girl has stayed briefly with us while out travelling around Australia. Anyone is welcome to stay with us—I love meeting new people. I stayed at many of the studs in the U.K. because I was travelling on my own and hotels are too lonely. England was at its best—so green and pretty. I never wanted to leave. Then I went on to Finland and finally to Stockholm for the Four-in-hand driving at the World Equestrian Games. A few days later I was staying with Marianne Seidenfaden, the President of the Welsh Pony and Cob Society in Denmark. She took me out driving behind a black pair of C geldings, one of which was Synod Shearger, a big winner in harness.

It was difficult to come back to earth when I arrived home. Somehow, cleaning out stables seemed tame after all of my adventures. I bored friends and acquaintances with my endless videos and photos.

Acheron Stud has the dubious honor of being by far the biggest Cob stud in Australia. In the middle of Winter with the rain pelting down, I wonder why I bother. It must be that treasured magic moment when my special favourites are in for the night, munching happily, smelling of a mixture of healthy horse, hay and shampoo that keeps me happy. Also, selling stock that brings much pleasure for the new owners is very satisfying. While I have many interest in life, I can honestly say "Cobs are my pleasure."

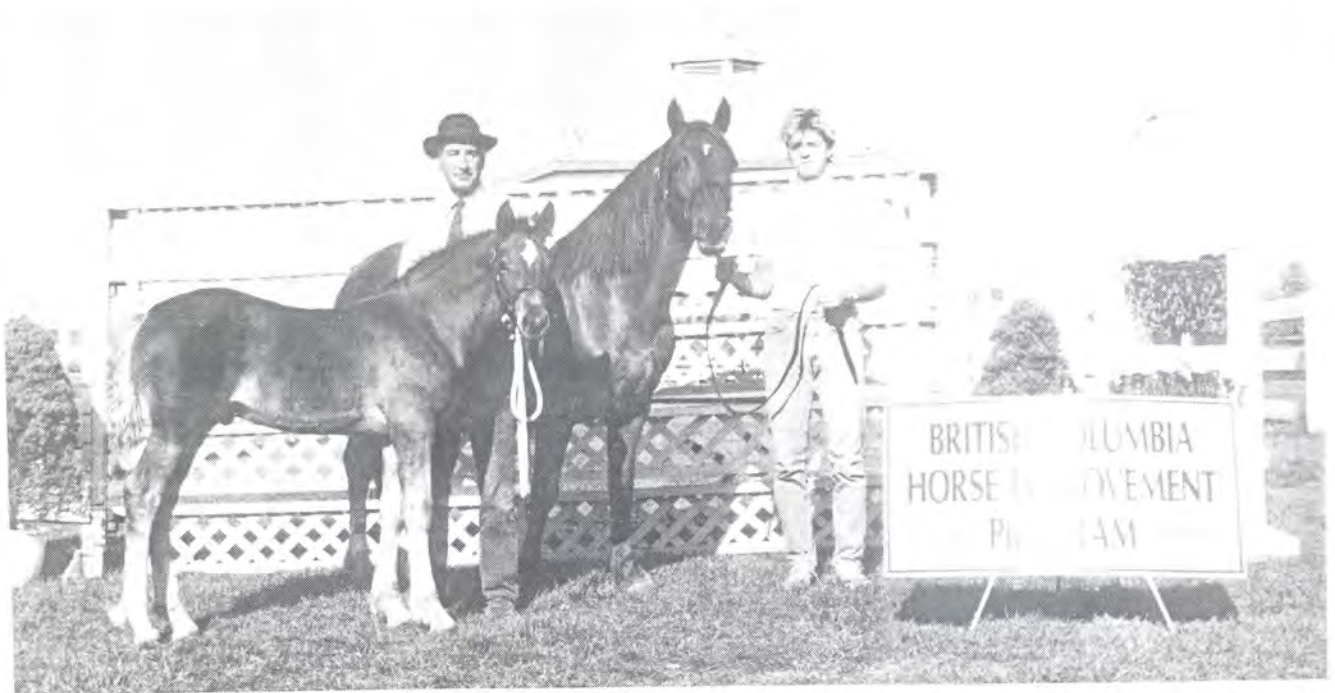
THE CHANCE OF A LIFETIME!

This 12-year old Chestnut mare is bred "in the purple" going back to **Nebo Black Magic**, **Tyhen Comet** and **Pentre Eiddwen Comet**. She is in foal to **Llanarth Maldwyn ap Braint** (**Llanarth Braint** x **Rhosfarch Morwena**), due the end of May. Other offspring of Dilys' by Maldwyn include: **Brynarian Bleddyn**, who, as a 3-year old was Supreme Champion of Show at the B.C. Welsh Pony & Cob Assn. Annual Show in 1990 where his yearling, **Cwmfadog Dylan**, won the futurity. The latter placed gold as a weanling in the B.C. Horse Improvement Program.

Wow! NACC is getting bigger and bigger. Just spent most of the afternoon with it, and, with the Directory in addition, I'm feeling crisply up to date with Welsh Cob affairs from coast to coast in two countries.

Suppose it's renewal time, so we'll get ready to go through the rigamarole of procuring a US dollar Money Order for the purpose. This involves driving 40 miles to town, passign by the convenient banking machine and joining the disgusting line up inside the bank! All for the good cause, I guess, but if the many nations in Europe can agree on some form of monetary unity, isn't it time for the two nations on the North American continent to get their acts together?

Back to the subject of Cobs. Incidentally, the Horse of the Year Show Cob, mentioned on page 3, I'm afraid, is probably a British riding Cob, not a breed, but a type of horse, most likely of mixed breeding, though some of these could, of course belong to the Welsh Cob breed. On page 9,

I think I saw a familiar face. If my memory doesn't play tricks on me, (yes, I am getting old), the Welsh Cob performing in Dressage during the International Welsh Show in Denmark, LLANGARTH GWYFOR, was the first Section D stallion imported into the Netherlands many years ago, while I lived in that country. I became aware of him after seeing a charcoal drawing of this beautiful dark-dappled dun in a NL horse magazine. Never managed to go see him in the flesh, but I kept drooling over his picture, later joined by a photograph I clipped from a stud ad. I had been considering the breed, at that time totally unknown in the Netherlands, after meeting one in England—28 years ago—an unregistered Section D mare of 14.2 hh., dapple grey with a typical deep and solid Cob build, dainty fetlock feather, neat, lightly dished Welsh face, who was without question the most hard working, versatile, durable, easy keep, free moving, and perhaps opinionated (and entitled to be so) school and trail horse in the riding school string. A gem of a horse, called Lady; what else, except when we called her other names, cleaning her manure-stained right hock and quarter first thing in the morning. She had the habit of spending the night on top of a pile of droppings she would carefully arrange for the purpose in the corner of her stall. Anyway, this wasn't about Lady to begin with, but about handsome GWYFOR. How delightful to see he is still going strong, somewhere, still in NL? He must be a middle-aged horse by now. And his picture, oh, some 18 years ago, convinced me that if ever I was to have a horse, it was to be one of these dashing Welsh, with the chiseled features, flying mane and feather, powerful build and the stubborn conviction that they were born to fly, their feathered feet being every bit as good as the wings of that old horse the Greeks called Pegasus.

Anyway, my days are no longer short of real life Welsh Cobs, nor are my husband's. (Maybe the "feathered" Cobs were a good meeting ground, as he was raised with Jutlander horses, and I with Friesians—neither breed is lacking fetlock decoration!) Color wise, I've had to settle for next best to dun. Most of ours share their sire's (Cwmfelen Golden Eclipse) dark pigmented cream color, overlaid with dapple grey, with blonde or light grey mane. This can be confusing. It gets to the point where family friends, asked to bring in His Majesty (now gelded) come home with one of the daughters. Teaches them to look a little closer, to find out for themselves, that gelding a stallion doesn't go so far as to turn him into a mare! Not that Eclipse worries about it. He likes his new state of life, much easier to "keep a close eye on the girls" now that he's turned out with them permanently.

We've discovered that he is every bit as good a candidate as my mare, Gwenda, for our form of winter sports, bareback riding. With wide "padded" backs, a "sunk" spine, and a very rhythmic and soft way of going,

Welsh Cobs have got to be the ultimate bareback horses. And it's so much warmer in these cold days! The Cobs are the first type of horse I have found to be a real pleasure to ride without a saddle.

We had a successful spring clinic at our farm, teaching horse handling, body work, leading through obstacles, etc. to a group of ten local horse people, using the Cobs as "assistants" for hands on practising. The horses managed to tone down their bubbly Welsh spirits, and displayed remarkable patience with the long and repetitious hours, maintaining good natured smiles throughout. Even the two year olds, who suffer from a short attention span, behaved like troopers, making a modest, but definite contribution to building a good name for their breed.

Wishing you, your family and Cobs a glorious new season with lots of activities. All the best,

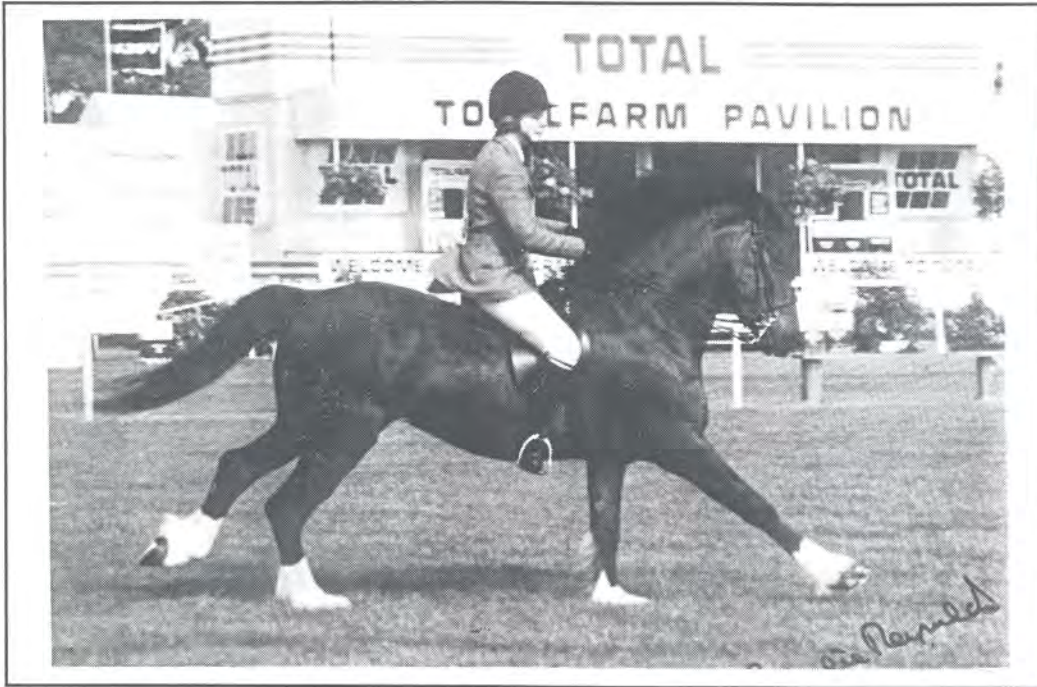

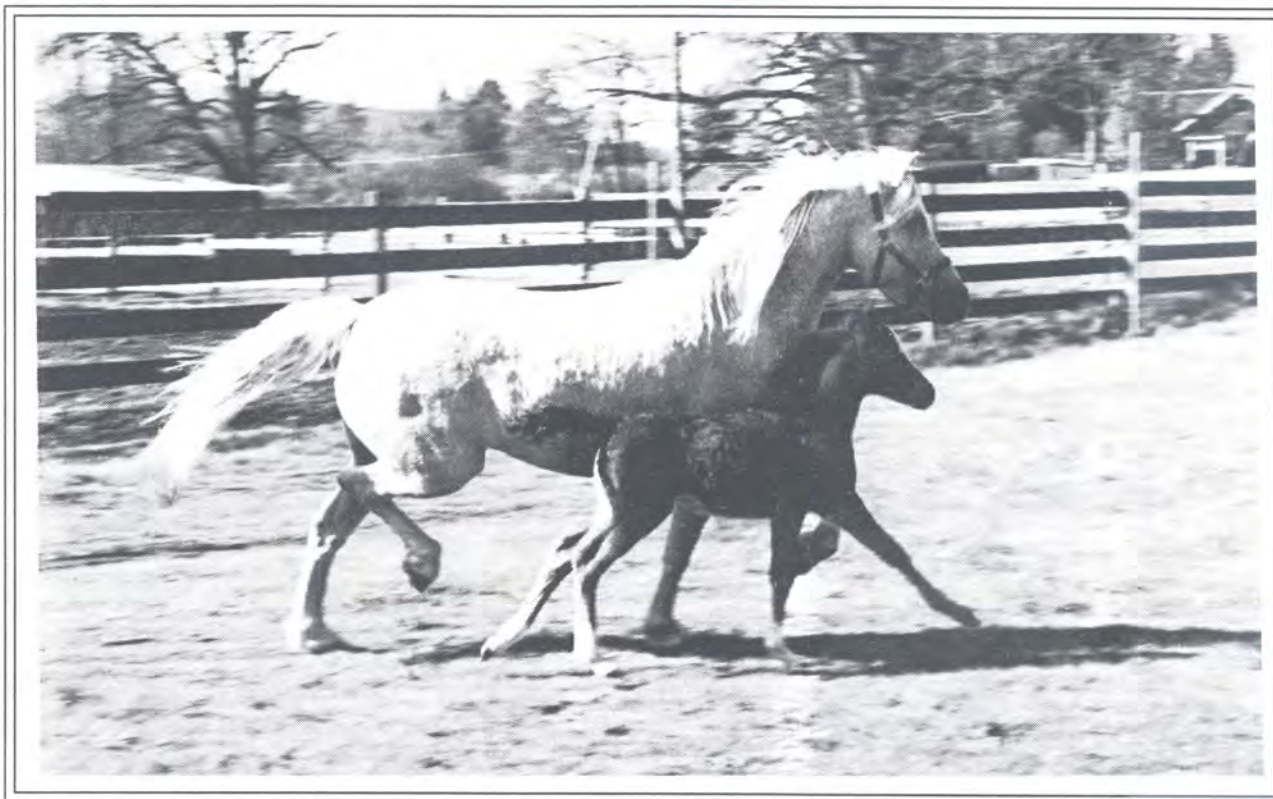

ABOUT LARGE WELSH PART-BREDS

From The Welsh Pony & Cob Society, 6 Chalybeate
Street, ABERYSTWYTH, Dyfed SY23 1HS

BACKGROUND

The Welsh Cob historically has been crossed with many types and breeds of horses. These include Irish Draughts, Warmbloods, Cleveland Bays, Arabs and, most popular, with Thoroughbreds.

WHAT IS A LARGE WELSH PART-BRED?

Horses classified as large Welsh Part-Breds are over 14.2 hands with a minimum of 25% Registered Pure Welsh blood. The Welsh input comes from either the sire or the dam, not as is thought in some quarters - only from the sire. It can come from crossing two animals who each have 25% Welsh or from any other combination which ensures the 25%.

There is no height limit on Welsh Part-Breds.

In addition to producing large Welsh Part-Breds by crossing Welsh Cobs with larger breeds, they can also be bred up from the smaller Welsh Ponies and Part-Breds.

They are eligible at any age for registration in the Welsh Pony and Cob Society's Welsh Part-Bred Register.

WHY BREED THEM?

Welsh Cobs are an ideal foundation for breeding competition horses. Breeders value their qualities of toughness, courage and intelligence, movement and natural jumping ability.

ACHIEVEMENTS

Large Welsh Part-Breds are increasingly in evidence in all the major disciplines of equestrian sport including Dressage, Showjumping, Driving and Eventing.

They are also very successful in the showing and are a source of Riding Club and family horses.

Crossing a half or threequarter bred back to a Welsh Cob produces a stronger driving or riding type.

CHOOSING WELSH COBS TO BREED WITH

The points to look for include:

size - but keep to type in depth, action, quality and length of rein
temperament

movement - strong hock action with hind leg brought well forward underneath the animal, promoting and allowing freedom of the shoulder

good bone - with clean flat joints

performance

Just as much care needs to be taken over selecting the non-Welsh parent.

Systematic cross-breeding with Welsh Cobs has been very limited. Identifying performance lines is therefore all too often impossible at present as there is little data to work with.

SUMMARY

As selective breeding programmes using Welsh bloodlines become established greater numbers of quality large Welsh Part-Breds should be available. The cross is beginning to attract the recognition it deserves for breeding versatile horses for competition, leisure or showing.

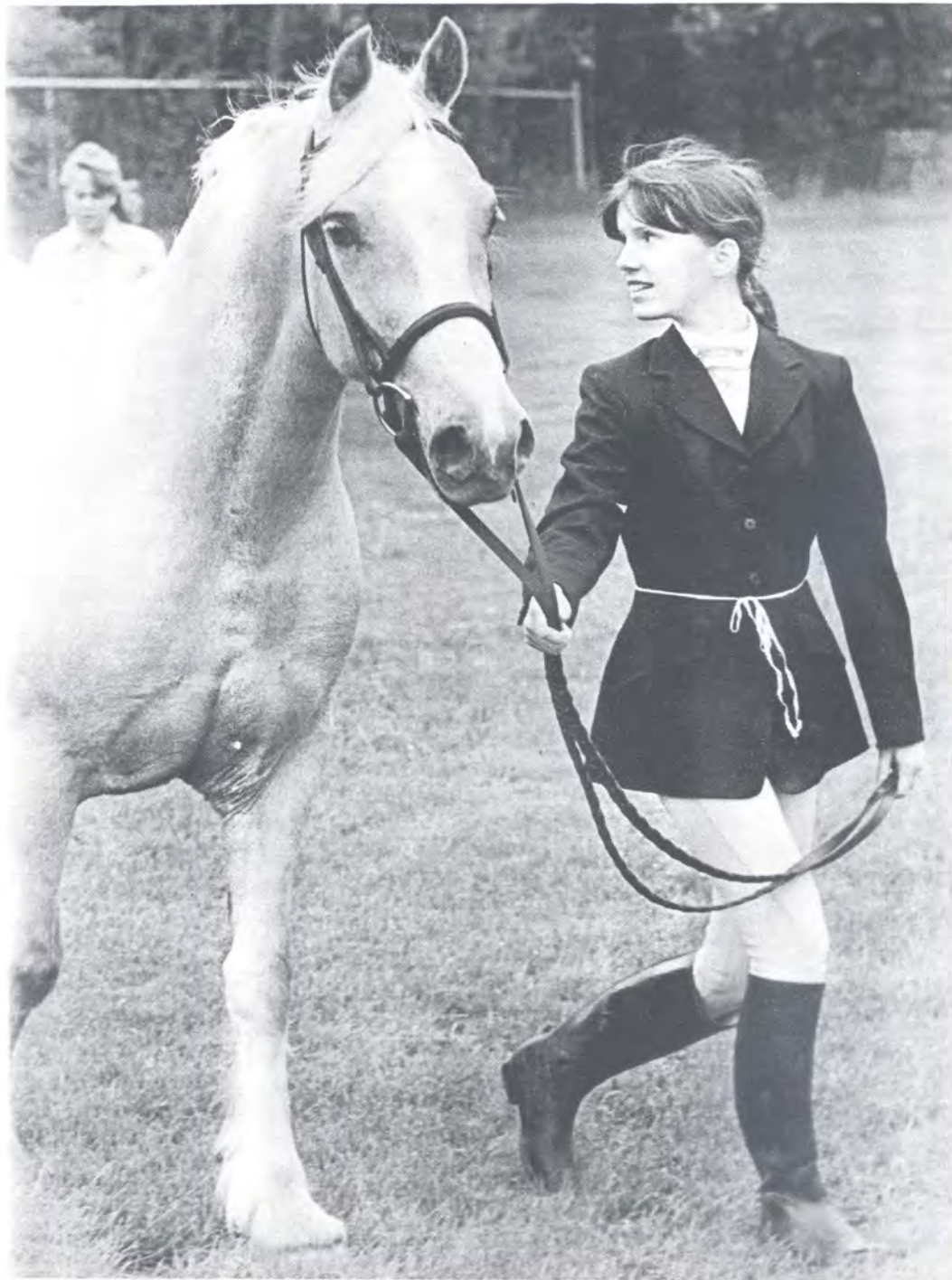

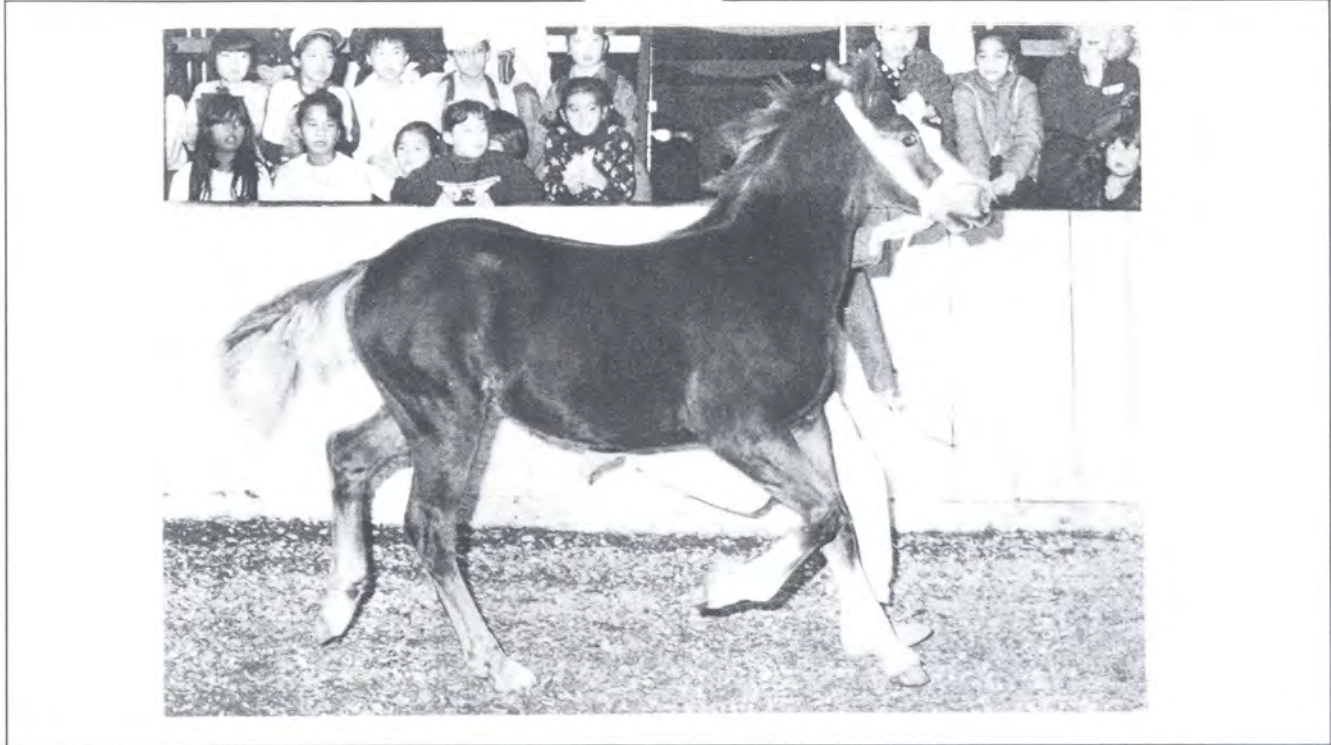

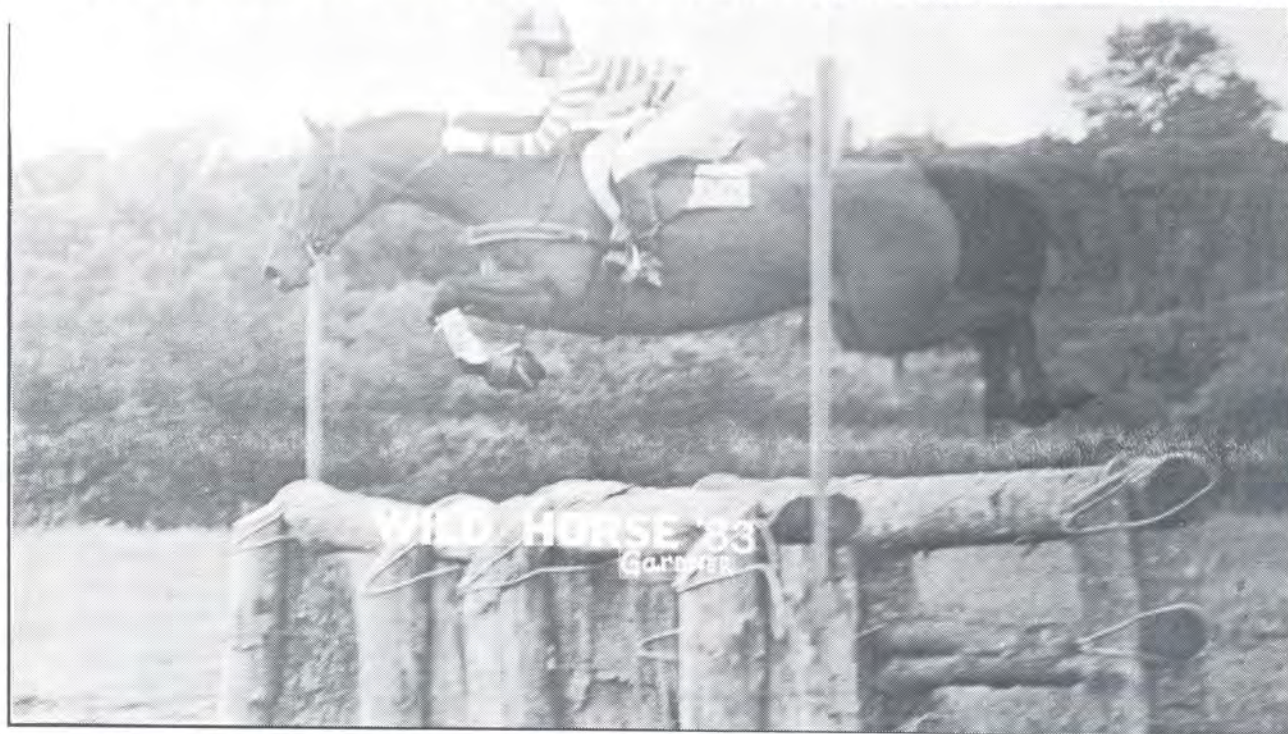
