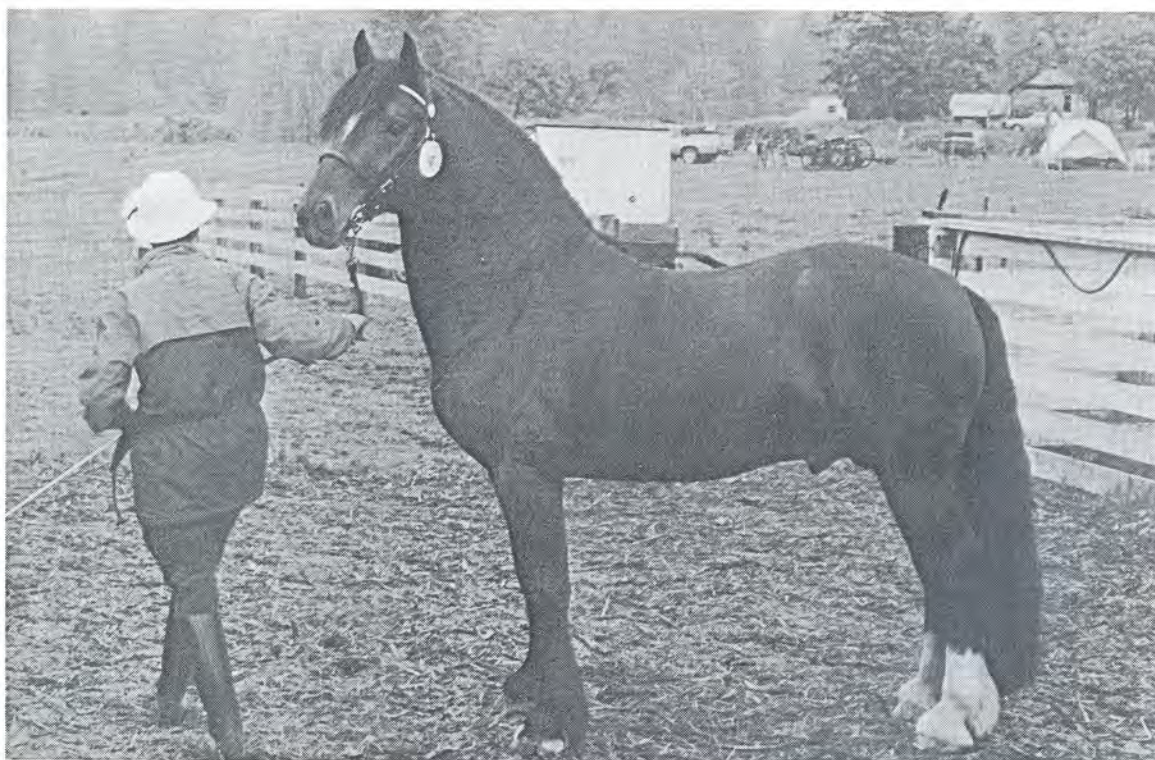

UNITED STATES

The 11th Annual First Fruits of Harvest, sponsored by the Winkelman Foundation for the handicapped was held the fourth Saturday of September southwest of Lohrville, Iowa. Participants enjoyed outdoor activities of team driving to a pony-powered grain grinder, farm animal handling, cow milking and Share-time. All events sponsored by the Foundation are part of a Christian renewal program funded totally by donations and staffed entirely by volunteers.

CANADA

The International Conference agreed that animals correctly registered from purebred Welsh Stock in any country with a Welsh Pony & Cob Society should be acceptable internationally. This was subject to the introduction of authentication procedures. While in attendance at the Conference, Jean Morton, Canada observed, "The next issue address was the Overseas Registry. A temporary relaxation of one of the parent Society's registration regulations was agreed to by Council on September 6, 1989 and amplified on June 26, 1991. That the progeny of pure bred animals exported with the correct documentation at the time of exportation be accepted, providing they have been correctly registered in the country concerned." Whereas applicable, authentication procedures will be prepared in the first instance by each country concerned, as they would be aware of any problems which might exist. There will be a time limit set by the parent Society, giving ample time for people from overseas Societies to apply. Most Canadian registrations will present no problem. The only questionable ones would include F.S, F.S. 1 mares, or ponies imported from Great Britain, without the correct export documentation. These ponies will be reviewed by a panel of three arbitrators in Great Britain, who will consider the application and report to Council. In no instance will a Canadian animal's registration status be affected. The end result, however, will be that Canadian ponies would be entered into the Overseas Registry, thereby achieving worldwide recognition. This is a "one-off" relaxation and applications must be received, via each country's own Society between 1st January, 1992 and 31st December, 1993.

The newsletter of the Canadian Society is always loaded with very interesting information—many articles, transfers, address changes, letters from members and stallion reports. Each year, for example, a Stallion Report is printed which lists the stallion, registration number, owner and number of mares bred. The report for 1990 reveals Brynarian Bleddyn, D 6120, owned by Norman Evans of B.C. bred two mares.

Canadian Welsh Recollections is a comprehensive, carefully-researched book illustrating the development of Welsh ponies and Cobs in Canada. The writing of this book has been a true labour of love, involving two years. We have taken the threads of the stories of the individual studs and woven them into a rich tapestry of the Canadian Welsh heritage. The prestige of this collection comes in the realizing that we, as breeders, are now part of this tapestry's colourful pattern. Cost is \$35 per copy, plus \$2.50 postage. The Welsh Pony and Cob Society has reprinted a new price list of miscellaneous items including calendars, stud books, pamphlets and brochures. Prices are up slightly due to the VAT increase (Value Added Tax) which now stands at 17.5%. The 1992 post card calendar is £1.50, the *Welsh Champions* series by Dr. Wynne Davies are £4.95 while the Welsh Bible, *Welsh Ponies and Cobs*, also by Dr. Davies is £16.50. The oldest stud books available, 1964-1965 are £5.20 while the most current, 1985-1986 is £22. The 1991 Journal, also known as the Greenbook, is now £6. To convert to dollars, look up the current exchange rate in your local newspaper and multiply that rate times the price listed above. It is requested that payment be made by International Money Order in sterling drawn on a Bank in the U.K. and you have the total cost of your order! It's a great idea to consolidate orders. Ballet on Horseback

If any of you Cob enthusiasts travelled British Airways last July on your way to the Royal Welsh as I was, you possibly picked up the airlines In Flight magazine, *Highblyfe*. Amid articles on Venice, Ice Cream, the Orient Express and a review of two movies about Christopher Columbus, was an article entitled "Ballet on Horseback" by Libby Purves.

The "Magnificent" were pictured—The Riding School of Vienna, Jennie Loriston-Clark on Dutch Gold, Annie MacDonald with Floriano, and an excellent introduction for the uneducated on Dressage. Naturally, any article about horses catches my attention but even more exciting was a paragraph, and I quote as follows:

Even the most decorous movements of the standard dressage competition bears echoes of battle. But more importantly they all—as trainers take pains to stress—also echo natural movements and behaviours of horses in the wild. Even the Piaffe or standing trot,

which seems a strange contrived dance for a practically minded animal to do spontaneously, is—so Jennie Loriston-Clark once told me—quite natural. 'I have seen a WELSH COB doing the Piaffe all by himself in his stable, just out of excitement.'

I just about did the Piaffe myself when I read this famous rider's words. Isn't it worthy of the WELSH COB to receive recognition in such distinguished company?

So, it's up to us to get our Cobs out in the public eye and really show them off! I have entered Derwen Tequila in her first dressage test on October 13, at the Ernie Howlett Park. She is only 3 years old, but the experience and exposure can only increase the public's awareness of this versatile breed.

The Royal Welsh Show

Can three dedicated Welsh enthusiasts do London, visit studs, shop until the suitcases will hold no more, attend an International Conference, and spend three days at the Royal Welsh Show in one week? The answer is a resounding YES!

The trip really started for me when I boarded the 767 and located my seatmate, Ann Lamb of the Avondale Stud in Washington. Needless to say, we talked ponies and cobs all the way across the Atlantic. Jean Morton, our other Canadian Conference delegate had arrived earlier that day. After a couple of hours in bed, we were up and raring to go to London. However, luck was not with us in our plans to tour the city. Every time we saw a sightseeing bus, it was going in the opposite direction, just leaving the bus stop or quitting for the day. Eventually we admitted defeat and took a cab to see many of the main sights.

The next day we picked up our car and headed off to Builth Wells via the Springbourne and Rosedale Studs. Our Bed and Breakfast was located six miles out of Builth Wells in a 500-year old pub with two rooms to let. We were the first guests of the new manager. The pub was typically Welsh, crowded with locals who entertained us with various Welsh songs and hymns.

Sunday we travelled to Llandrindod Wells to the International Conference.

Nine countries were represented in total. The major topic was the relaxation document regarding acceptance into the Welsh Pony and Cob Society of Great Britain Stud Book. That evening was spent writing reports on the conference.

Jean proved her worth as a tour guide the next day by suggesting that we do all our shopping on the first day of the fair. We were there when the shops opened at 8:30, by 4:00 we had seen every display. Our arms were longer than when we had started in the morning and our wallets were pounds lighter. That evening, we drove into England to visit the artist who does the limited edition Welsh models and brooches. Our visit there saw her with very little stock left.

Tuesday was the exhibiting of Section A, C and D with the B's and stallions from the A's and D's to be shown on Wednesday. Once again, Jean had us there bright and early to watch all the ponies. That evening we drove up onto

the top of the hills to see ponies owned by Joan Curry. Joan does seven generations of extended Welsh pedigrees, including colours.

By Wednesday morning I was beginning to feel like one of the three little pigs trying to avoid the wolf; Jean had us in our seats by 7:30, lunches by our sides. The ponies and cobs started showing at 8:00 and for eight straight hours we sat there enthralled. You hear of the running of the cob stallions and this year the handlers of Tireinon Confidence who had recently sold for over 10,000 pounds, ran him for several minutes before the crowd, who absolutely loved it.

In total, there were 429 Welsh Mountain ponies entered with the Champion being Dyfrdwy Seren Arian (mare), Reserve Fron Bach Crystal (filly). Two hundred fifty-six Welsh ponies were entered and Boston Bodicea (mare) was the Champion with the stallion Paddock Camargue the Reserve. Welsh Pony of Cob Type had 220

entries and Glynwyn Diamante (mare) stood over Waxwing Reward (stallion) for Champion. Pantanamlwg Red Fox (stallion) defeated 450 entries to be named the Champion with Fronarth Welsh Model (mare) in Reserve.

That evening was spent trying to fit everything into suitcases, and later Donna came over to bring us our orders. The pub was lively and singing carried on until the wee hours of the morning.

After a leisurely morning, we headed off towards London with stops in Monmouth and at one stud. Now only one thing was left to do—fight the horrendous crowds at the airport before we were able to return home.

While the trip was short, many overseas contacts were made, Canadian member/breeder books were quickly snatched up as well as newsletter covers. Canada is making her name in the International world of Welsh.

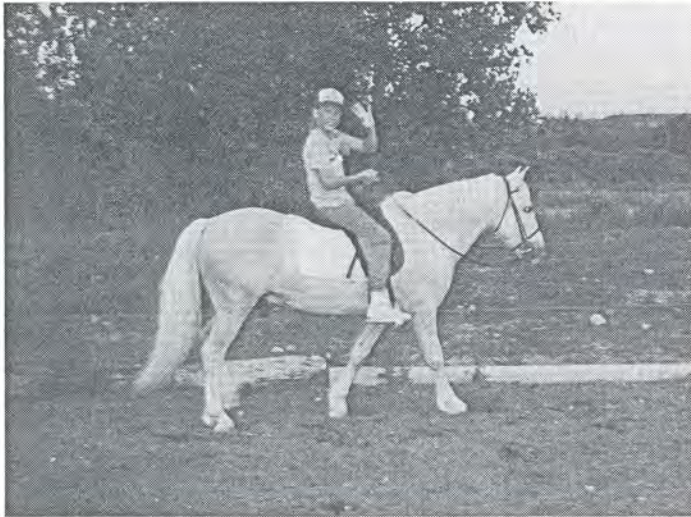

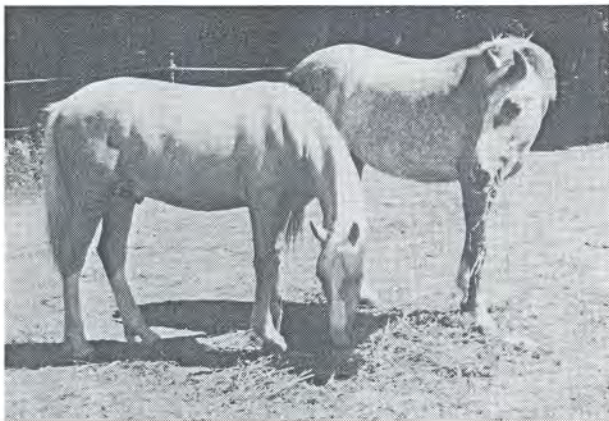

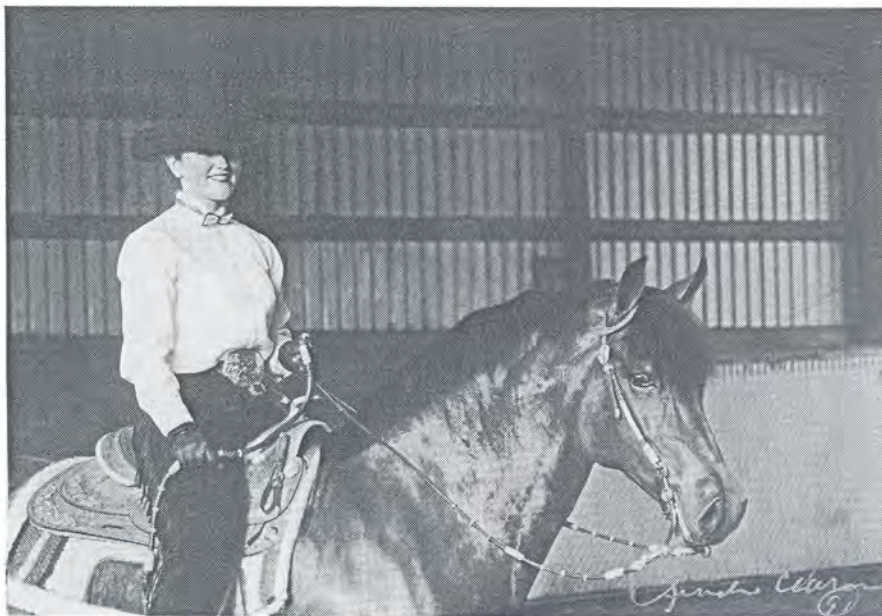

Sport Horse

...Or is it a Sport Pony?

Braving the crowd of Sport Horse Breeders at the 1991 Los Angeles Breeders Classic on Sunday, August 25th were two audacious pony breeders, Mrs. Janina Owens of JayCobs Farm and Mrs. Stephanie Abronson of Pony Cross Farm.

They are determined to find a way to show and market their well-bred ponies with conformation more like that of the Sport Horse. These ponies are often produced from Welsh and Welsh Cob, Connemara, and Quarter ponies, crosses with these basic pony breeds, and with Morgan and Quarter Horses. They are heavier boned and bodied than the traditional Hunter Pony. Yet many of these ponies will cross over into the Hunter Pony Division as mature animals. By attending the L.A. Breeders Classic, they hoped to prove to show manager Glenda McElroy their interest and support for a "Sport Pony Division."

Three Welsh Cob crossbred ponies—which are warmbloods every bit as much as Oldenburgs, Hanoverians, Trakhners, etc. were brought to the show. Judge William Solyntjes from Mankato, Minnesota, admired and encouraged Mrs. Owens and Mrs. Abronson in their endeavor to build interest for a "Sport Pony Division." Admittedly it was difficult to judge the ponies against the larger warmblood horses, but Judge Solyntje's comments were that the ponies shown on Sunday were very fine examples of a scaled-down version of good sport horses. He anticipates the pleasure of being able to judge the "Sport Pony Division" in the near future.

Following a discussion with Ms. McElroy as to how many breeders and entries she would require to promote a

pony division in Sport Horse breeding, she said she would be happy to include such a division in next year's Sport Horse breeding shows.

Progressive Oregon Dressage Society plans Pony Dressage Awards

The Oregon Dressage Society will be presenting year-end awards in a special division created for pony riders in 1991. The division will recognize top riders and their pony-mounts in Sr. and Jr. Training Level.

All members present at the February 9 general meeting of O.D.S. (Oregon Dressage Society) voted unanimously in favor of the additional division after hearing a presentation by O.D.S. member Kathleen Fangsrud of Foxbrush Farm Ponies, Woodburn, Oregon.

Fangsrud, who competes at the Sr. Training level, said that she and an increasing number of riders and trainers feel there are serious riders whose needs are best met by ponies, the most obvious being youth riders. She argued that the creation of an awards division that recognized the smaller—in many cases more appropriately-sized mount—would encourage dressage competition and thus better horsemanship among young riders.

The Welsh Pony and Cob Society of America (WP&CSA) and the United States Dressage Federation (USDF) already offer year-end awards to high-point Welsh Ponies and Cobs. Ponies are, however, required to have at least part-bred registration with the WP&CSA including the USDF which makes its awards through the All Breeds Award system in conjunction with WP&CSA.

O.D.S. awards system has no registration requirement other than current membership with O.D.S., describing a pony simply as "Any horse 14.2H and under."

Horse/rider combinations are required to show at O.D.S. approved shows, performing AHSA-approved training level test alongside their larger-sized competitors. Points are then tabulated at year-end with pre-registered ponies being separated out and their points compared only against themselves for high-point awards in both Sr. and Jr. Training Level.

Measure cards will not be required and height challenges will be settled at the show by measure by the judge or ring steward.

The Youth Division is the second fastest-growing division in the United States Dressage Federation, according to ODS President Donna Longacre, and USDF wishes to continue to encourage youth participation in dressage events. O.D.S. is recognized as a "Progressive" chapter of USDF, according to Longacre, and if the pony division plan is approved and implemented, it will certainly show a continuation of that quality.
