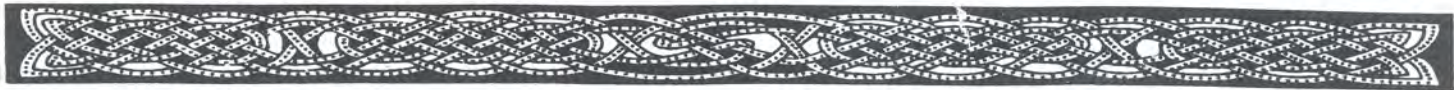

Our family will remember 1991 as the year-of-breeding. After getting to know Brynarian Cerys, going through the years of training (both Cerys and the Family) and testing our efforts in the show ring, we decided it was time to think of the future and to find a complimentary stud service. As many would testify, the task was not as easy as one might think. There are many fine cob studs in the United States. When the dust settled, so did we. Okeden Taffy stole our hearts. In a few words: Line breeding Llanarth, Chestnut, Flaxen Mane & Tail, Quality Get, Presence, Personality, Beauty. These were some of

the reasons we chose Taffy. We'll have to admit, seeing a stud with the same chestnut coat and the same flaxen mane and tail as our girl probably tipped the scale of decision. It should also be mentioned that Carlene Sharples' knowledge and guidance made the decision easier. She obviously knows the A.I. routine and she was there to assist us every step of the way. Cerys took on the first breeding and as of this writing, she's beginning to show matronly signs. Come March, we'll be tying a pink ribbon in her mane with hopes of a foal who looks just like her sire and dam.

Shows were kept to a minimum this year, what with expense, the breeding and injury. All last Winter, Cerys was going through the intense reining tuning. Our initial plan had been to let our trainer work exclusively with her in preparation for the Spring and maybe Summer '91 NRHA (Nat'l Reining Horse Assoc.) show season, with a breeding in the May/June timeframe. As fate would have it, showing in the NRHA circuit fell out of the plan. On a blustery late Winter day, we had her taken to a small NRHA show in the upper Mid-West. We chose a small show so we could see where we were at in the tuning process. Cerys looked great! I'd swear she had a couple 30' slides. When she accelerated, every muscle in her body bulged. We were already making plans for the first large show of the season in Rantoul, Illinois; however, after our return, we noticed that Cerys seemed a bit tender in the lower left leg. Swelling followed, as well as a trip to the vet. The trips to Rantoul, St. Paul, Milwaukee, et. al. were out and stall rest followed by light turnout. Cerys had popped her left hind splint. Another bend in the road, but it lead us to Taffy, and all the prospects of a fine foal. Laurie, our vet, assured us that with proper rest, Cerys would be as good as new and she was correct. Cerys has fully recovered and we've resumed light reining work, jumping and even took her through trail, barrel and poles classes at

her last show. I do believe my lips were hooked around my ears when we did the final run down in the poles class. Thank goodness Cerys understands that whoa means tuck the hind legs and stop all motion. As to how the splint was popped, we can only guess. Laurie hypothesizes that Cerys was kicked in the horse trailer. (She was with 3 or 4 others.) It must have been one heck of a blow. Thank goodness we had her shipping boots on. It's amazing that she went through the show without complaint. Anyway, we have no complaints. \_\_\_\_ happens! Now we have the excitement of a Taffy foal to look forward to.

Hope the year has been good for you and that next year will be even better! Please accept our check, to continue our subscription to NACC. We don't want to miss an issue!!!

1/2/92 Dear NACC

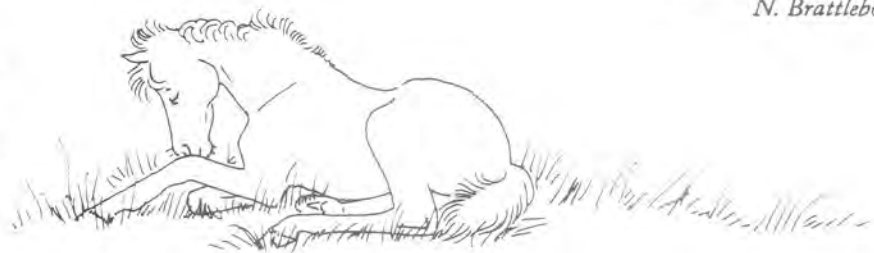

Three Welsh Cob owners/breeders of Southern California sponsored a Welsh Cob Exhibition on December 14 at Ernie Howlett Park in Rolling Hills. A toy soldier, a biker in black, a medieval princess, a buckaroo and a cowgirl all lent an air of fun to the presentation. Blessed by the sun and no wind, three imported Welsh Cob stallions were featured: \*Derwen Dashing Duke and \*Tuscani Masada, owned by the Glenhaven Welsh Cob Stud, Suzanne Glenn, and \*Leyeswick Brenin, owned by Jaycobs Farm. In addition, three imported Welsh Cob mares, three California bred mares and three purebred California bred foals along with four part-bred Welsh cobs were also paraded before an interested and enthusiastic audience.

Artfully choreographed by Mrs. Janina Owens, owner of \*Leyeswick Brenin, the program began with a salute feature the Welsh flag and national anthem, followed by a driving exhibition by this Welsh Cob stallion. Brenin was then exhibited over fences first by his owner than by ten-year-old Sarojini Hirschleifer. While tack and rider were changing to Western attire, talented trainer Kay Smith demonstrated driving training with a two-year-old part-bred Cob filly. The same filly, Mairlod Croes Ffair, bred and raised at Pony Cross Farm by Stephanie Abronson, was also ridden in a Western theme.

Following a very short break, all the animals were presented in-hand. Special comments were added to this portion of the program by Mrs. Rose Hardwick, a guest who had traveled from England for this event. In the final portion of the program, Mrs. Hardwick, owner of the Tuscani Stud, where she breeds Welsh Cobs, mingled with the audience to answer their questions while fancy costume kurs were ridden to music. The most exceptional was created and ridden by ten-year-old Aimee Spaulding on her two-year-old Welsh Cob pony, Mairlod Ffavor. Dressed as the toy soldier, Aimee and Ffavor danced to the music from the Nutcracker Suite, to "Ohs... and Ahs..." and eager applause.

To round out this pleasant day, the Welsh Cob breeders sponsored a raffle, the best prizes being breedings to the imported Cob stallions. The breeding to \*Leyeswick Brenin was won by Cindy Dishman of Pleasant Hill, Oregon; Mary Lou Williams of Rancho Palos Verdes, California, won the breeding to \*Derwen Dashing Duke.

Bravo to Stephanie, Suzanne and Janina for orchestrating such an educational and extraordinary program to introduce Cobs to Southern California! When it comes to promotion, California creates the commotion!!

*"NORTHLEACH WELSH" By Dr. E. Wynne Davies, Excerpts from Horse and Hound, July 25, 1991*

There were over 800 entries for the classes at Northleach show, Glos, held at Lord Vestey's picturesque Stowell Park.

The Jones family's 11-year-old chestnut section C mare, Tyngwndwn Moonlight, moved with great gusto to win her female championship and she was well represented by her two daughters, the three-year-old youngstock champion Tyngwndwn Brehines and the second-placed filly foal, Tyngwndwn Dewdrop. Her son, Tyngwndwn Bouncing King, also won the working hunter—all three being sired by Nebo Bouncer.

However, the section C championship went to Cerdin and Doreen Jones's exceptional stallion Synod Roy Rogers who, until last year, had been running out with his mares.

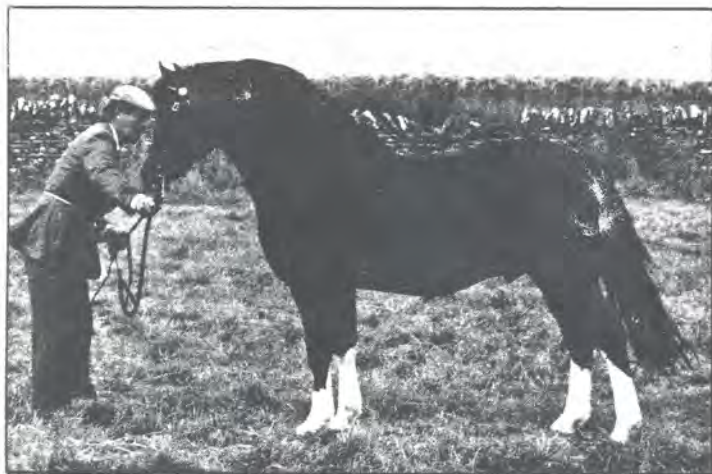
The strongest in-hand class was that for Welsh Cob yearling

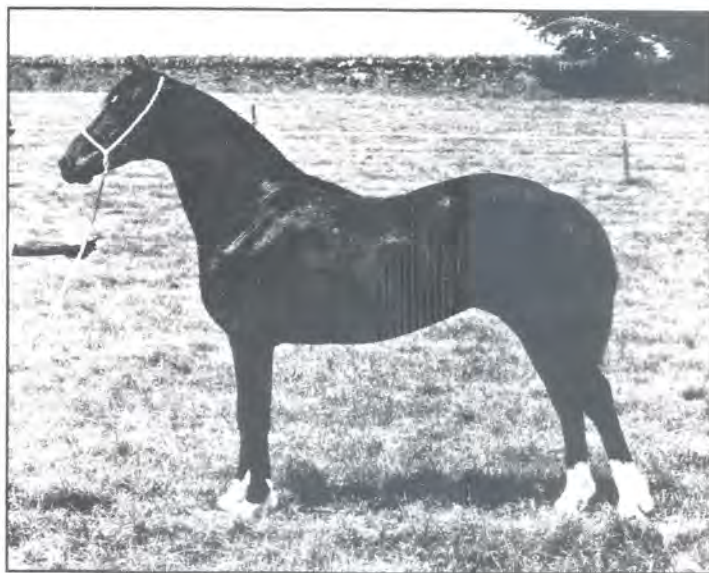

**M**onday, November 18, 1991 saw the dispersal sale of Welsh Cobs collected by Marvin Shelly and later transferred to John Neeman of Dallas, Texas. The short notice of this sale limited the number of buyers present but telephone bids were received. The top selling animal was \*Okeden Clover whose telephone bid from Wisconsin topped the sale at

\$3100. \*Sydenham Morwydden was second high at \$3,000. Thirty-one imported and domestic cobs and their offspring were sold for an unofficial average price of \$1173. Several out-of-state buyers were represented but the majority of sales were to Texas performance homes. They should soon be seen in local Welsh open and driving competitions.

Sadly, John Neeman died the week following the sale.
