Western Dressage Division

The Western Dressage Division represents points earned in Western Dressage. Both sanctioned and schooling Western Dressage Shows to count, but only Western Dressage Association of America (WDAA) tests may be submitted for this Division and Judges must be USDF 'L' graduates or WDAA approved or USEF/USDF Dressage 'r', 'R', or 'S'. There are 5 different Western Dressage Divisions offered: Intro, Basic, Level 1, Level 2, & Level 3. The Equine may compete in multiple Divisions within the Western Dressage Division and each level requires the annual one-time \$35 fee. Medallions are earned over the lifetime of the equine. Each medallion level is described below.

Exhibitors are to submit all test scores earned over the entire year on the designated form and the Year-End placings will be determined by each entrant's average of the top 3 scores submitted from 3 different Judges. One of the 3 scores must be from the highest test within the level. Scores below 55 are not eligible for submission.

Awards are earned by the equine entry alone, but the owner of the equine(s) in each score submitted must be a current WPCSA member.

All Western Dressage Division scores must be submitted on the Specified Western Dressage Division form either electronically or printed and mailed to the WPCSA National Office.

Medallion Points

Bronze: The Equine must earn three scores (of 55 or greater) from both Intro and Basic with at least two scores from each level being earned under different judges.

Silver: The Equine must earn three scores (of 55 or greater) from both First Level and Second Level with at least two scores from each level being earned under different judges.

Gold: The Equine must earn three scores (of 55 or greater) from Third Level with at least two scores being earned under different judges.
