



# WPCSA Open Show Program

## Dressage Division

The Dressage Division represents points earned in Dressage. Both USDF/USEF sanctioned and schooling (Non-Sanctioned) Dressage Shows to count (not including Western Dressage). There are 10 different USDF/USEF Sanctioned Dressage Divisions offered: Intro, Training, First Level, Second Level, Third Level, Fourth Level, Prix St. George, Intermediate I, Intermediate II, and Grand Prix. There are 6 Schooling or Non-Sanctioned Divisions offered: Intro, Training, First Level, Second Level, Third Level, and Fourth Level. The Equine may compete in multiple Divisions within the Dressage Division and each level/Division requires the annual one-time \$35 fee. Medallions are earned over the lifetime of the equine. Each medallion level is described below.

Exhibitors are to submit all test scores earned over the entire year on the designated form within 30 days of the event. ***The competition year runs from October 1 through September 30. Division placings will be calculated from the average of each entrant's three highest scores. Each of the scores will be from a different judge and at least one has to be from the highest test of that level.*** Scores below 55% are not eligible for submission.

Awards are earned by the equine entry alone, but the owner of the equine(s) in each score submitted must be a current WPCSA member.

All Dressage Division points must be submitted on the Specified Dressage Division form either electronically or printed and mailed to the WPCSA National Office.

### Medallion Points

#### **Dressage Medallion Requirements:**

**Bronze:** Six scores total

Training Level: Two Scores above 55% from two different judges

First Level: Two Scores above 55% from two different judges

Second Level: Two Scores above 55% from two different judges

**Silver:** Six scores total

Third Level: Three Scores above 55% from two or three different judges

Fourth Level: Three Scores above 55% from two or three different judges

**Gold:** Six scores total

Prix St. George: Three Scores above 55% from two or three different judges

Intermediate I: Three Scores above 55% from two or three different judges

**Platinum:** Six scores total

Intermediate II: Three Scores above 55% from two or three different judges

Grand Prix: Three Scores above 55% from two or three different judges
